The crest's main features are an orchid, an eagle and an open book.


The orchid, a vanda Miss Joachim and the national flower of Singapore, is a hardy but delicate flower symbolising stalwart Eusoffian traditions of loyalty, dignity, integrity and honour to hall and nation, balance with harmony, beauty and grace. The retention of the orchid reminds Eusoffians of the origins of the hall's traditions in Eusoff College.

The eagle symbolises the indomitable spirit of all Eusoffians, as well as an indefatigable desire to attain honour and excellent in all their pursuits.

Finally, the open book symbolises the unquenchable thirst for knowledge and academic achievement which all Eusoffians seek, a conviction in keeping with the aims of the University.

The year 2000/2001 has been outstanding by all measures. Right from the start, our Eusoffians did the Hall proud by taking the NUSSU Challenge Shield for Best Presentation, the Vice-Chancellor's Shield for Best Carnival Effort at the annual Rag and Flag Competition. Then we put up a splendid showing at the Inter-Hall Games by winning the Women's Championship and being first runner-up for the overall title. Shortly after, we had a fantastic Dance Production attended by more than 1000 people and our Guest-of-Honour Mr. Lee Yock Suan, Minister for Information and the Arts. Following the pioneering movie production last year, Eh! Films produced an original fulllength feature film Jack's Car which was screened to the public for four days. Our Guest-Of-Honour at the film was Mr. Abdullah Tarmugi, Minister for Community Development and Sports. Our choir Euphonia won the Acapella Talentime organised by the NTU CAC for the 2nd year running.

The creativity and enterprise of our residents were shown in the launching in February 2001 of U-Surf - a unique internet portal which provides a personal and friendly guide on university education, NUS and campus life to JC students who are considering admission, and any other interested parties. On the Forum Page of U-Surf, JC students will be able to post questions for discussion and answers will be offered by their friendly seniors at Eusoff Hall who were also once JC students facing the same issues. There is also a panel of specialists comprising professors, sports captains and student leaders to address the more complex questions.



During the year the JCRC and the Computer Committee implemented a unique Eusoff Credits System which allows residents to make payments for bus stamps, laser printouts, photographs, reservations for chartering of buses, buying T-shirts etc., online.

This year also marked the complete transition of Eusoff College to Eusoff Hall. Eusoff College, founded 1958 at Bukit Timah, was the predecessor to Eusoff Hall - although Eusoff Hall was established in 1988 and Eusoff College still continued to function as a hostel. In a moving ceremony attended by Vice-Chancellor Shih Choon Fong and many distinguished Eusoff alumni, the gates of the College were symbolically closed for the last time by the last principal of Eusoff College - Professor Lee Kok Onn. The mosaic crest of the University of Malaya which was built into the lobby of Eusoff College has since been re-installed at the porch of Eusoff Hall as a reminder of this historical connection.

I wish to thank the SCRC, the JCRC, Heads of Committees, Captains and each and every Eusoffian for your contribution to our success this year. I also wish to thank the Yearbook Committee for doing a good job of reporting on the year's events.

(this was just so Anti-Drug; we couldn't bring ourselves to do it.)


3. The other venue

One fine afternoon, we walked into the 1000-seater Hall, stood on the stage and after that we never considered other options.

- a. Junie's Violence had wanted the dancers to smear paint on white screens using their palms. It didn't work out because there were things like costume changes and general stage cleanliness to consider.
- b. Deborah's Insanity had intended for the dancers to don those foam pear covers, which come with the pears given at dinners, on their wrists. UV light would be shone on the dancers as they do those wavy hand movements during the part with children singing. However, the idea came to her two weeks before the actual performance and there was no time to source for 17 pairs of pear covers.

Including the costumes for the acting cast, we had at least 160 costumes.

The wardrobe committee had only 7 members.

6. Practices usually ended at 2 am

You want to know how hard the cast worked to get their dance steps right? Each dance had at least 1 practice a week. Practices began at 11pm because of IHG. If a dancer was in 4 dances, he would have put in at least 12 hours of practice each week - not including piecing sessions over the weekends, which lasted anything from 2 to 4 hours. Attendances for each practice though, remained at a high of at least 85%!

For those involved in Emptiness and Death & Disease practices were held on Saturdays. A cast member in both dances would have been in the studio from 2 pm (for Death) till 8 pm (for Emptiness) and then up to 11 pm for piecing. That's 9 hours spent in the studio EVERY SATURDAY for 6 weeks!

















7. The missing performer

Greed was a post-intermission piece that was supposed to be a digression from Pandora. The original idea was for a guy to appear as a big spender, flirting with the 16 dancers during the cha-cha segment. Navin, the co-producer, was selected for his famous sleazy facial expressions. On the actual day of performance, he pleaded stage fright and got out of the role.



The politically correct story is that he was tied up with administrative matters like ticket sales, front-of-the-house and reception for the guests. He did these so well that no one really complained about his absence on stage.

10. The Show Continued at Mohd. Sultan!
















And so I starts ...






The MCs for the night! Min Zi and Victor did a good job, injecting fun and laughter into the usually banal job of compering.

The comm. aims to promote a more in-depth understanding of Eusoff Hall, and hall-life, to potential hostelites

In December, we held an informal gathering for JC student leaders. The students were brought on a tour of the hall and saw 2 "showrooms" - specially spruced up beforehand, of course. This was followed by a fruitful forum with ERC and JCRC. Students learnt that they may approach us fo help such as contacts for sponsorship. The students were enthusiastic about this and all in all this establishing of first contact was a success.

But the most notable contribution for the year must surely be setting up of the USURF portal - a community service website which provides more information on various courses, hall admission and so on. Students may check out the FAQs or enter their own questions which will be redirected by ERC to the relevant people. This was officially opened at Dance Production 2001.



The committee also manned the Eusoff Hall Booth at NUS Open House '01 where we distributed pamphlets, past yearbooks and screened videos to attract potential hostelites.



EUSOFF VOLUNIARY CORPS

EVC is divided into 4 services: Children, Teenage, Elderly and the Intellectually Disabled to cater to the different interests and affinities of our volunteers. Together with Temasek volunteers, we organised the Grant-A-Wish project to get NUS students to contribute money to purchase specific items desired by the various groups and people we help. We also participated in the "Power to the Klds" Radiothon organised by SAFRA & MINDS. Here, Yearbook gives you more insight into 2 services: Children and Intellectually Disabled.

The children's service consists of 2 areas: tuition with primary school kids from the SIngapore Children's society in Henderson where volunteers are assigned a student to tutor every week; and helping kids with cancer at the National University Hospital.

"There are specific toys for specific age groups - board games for the bigger children and toy trucks for example, for the younger ones. I played with a boy with brain cancer once and he was supposed to be 4 years old but had the mental capacity of a baby. He couldn't speak and the whole session I played blocks with him ... It's quite sad and you really feel for the children. We're there to help them forget that they're sick so we never ask them if they 're afraid. There are nurses assisting all the time and sometimes the kid's parents or other relatives will be there. In December the hospital organised this Christmas party for the kids and there was this boy whom I played only once with. He came up to me and said hi and asked me if I remembered him! It makes you feel appreciated and they are always glad to have company." - Teo Minzi

EVC and even past EVC members help out at MINDS - the Movement for the Intellectually Disabled, in Clementi. It is a day centre and we help them to brush their teeth and dress up, play with them, swim with them (Water mobility), and bring them for walks. Sometimes we bring the clients to the supermarket where they learn how to interact with society and different environments. We teach them how to ride on escalators and climb stairs - skills most of us take for granted. We organised an X'mas party for them and we realised that they really enjoy dancing very much! (Some even had "boyfriends" or "girlfriends" they dance with!) We also organised a Sports Day at NUS for them. They don't always understand or respond to the volunteers. So it is doubly rewarding when they occasionally smile or laugh at us. They are like innocent children who have no qualms expressing their feelings though some are already 40 years old!





our handball guys had lots of heart and played with great enthusiasm against the other halls, keeping scorelines narrow. However they were denied a medal this year. Better luck next year guys!







"NOS definitely has a better system in terms of internet access (as compared to home). Lifestyle...no huge differences.And It's NOT FREEZING COLD IN CANADA ALL THE TIME! It gets very cold and very hot - so no I don't find Singapore unbearably hot."

"Germans are viewed in Europe as being fierce & humorless. Beware of stereotypes. I would invite people here to watch our February carnival. It has primordial traditions, animal traits ... but then the church came & domesticated most of these traditional customs successfully. Nevertheless, we all disguise ourselves & fool around on the streets and in pubs for 3 days. It's pretty wicked. Then there is unfortunately a 40-day fasting period."

"There is a massive gulf in university culture between NOS & the OK - mostly to do with drinking. British unis have a huge drinking culture - every hall has a bar, for instance. The bar is the centre of hall activities & freshers' week. But 1 night in the 1st sem., I was coming back & the lad who owns the van... sorry i've forgotten ur name mate, anyway the van was parked by the bus-stop with loads of people around. There was a group of girls & lads all wrecked out of their brains and they'd called the "Eusoff Ambulance" to collect them from "Sole Luna" cos they couldn't manage a cab IIt was an awesome night cos I had to carry battered, drunken 50 bodies onto the grass. It was priceless! I didn't think there was much of a drinking culture, how wrong I was, a beautiful moment!"




HUICHIN SAYS:

The freezer doesn't stink! (*ooh!*)






EUSOFFIS DIBLOCK


B-L-O-C-K-H-E-A-D!
