


Crest

The orchid, a Vanda Miss Joaquim and the national flower of Singapore is a hardy but delicate flower symbolising stalwart Eusoffian traditions of loyalty, dignity, integrity, and honour to hall and nation, balanced with harmony, beauty and grace. The retention of the orchid reminds Eusoffians of the origins of the hall in Eusoff College.

The colours of the crest are maroon to signify courage, gold to signify magnificence and white to signify sincerity.

Eusoff Hall started off this academic year with its strong tradition of excellence, by retaining the Vice-Chancellor's Shield for Best Flag Day Collection for Halls of Residence for the third consecutive year. Our residents collected the highest collection of \$79,000 for charity.

The movie "Snake", by EH! Productions, was screened to the public for 3 days at GV Marina. Based on a Chinese myth, EH! The superb cinematography and innovative script won high praise from the audience.

Dance Production's "First Ladies", played to a full house and appreciative audience at the University Cultural Centre, where the talents of our Eusoffians were put on display. The passionate dancing and zealous acting of the cast brought the audience on a journey through the rise and fall of Troy, at the hands of the beautiful Helen. As usual the costumes were exquisite and the stage props elegant.

Our sportsmen and women continued to do well in the Inter Hall Games where we came in runners-up. Our computer committee continued to maintain our innovative Eusoff Credits System which facilitates residents' purchases of goods and services provided by the Hall.

The Hall has also excelled in the area of community service under the Eusoff Voluntary Corp. The contributions of our residents to the community have expanded to four main target groups, namely the elderly, children, juvenile delinquents and the Children's Cancer Foundation. The dedication and charity of our volunteers was publicly recognized by the Rotary Club of Singapore and awarded the second position for the Community Service Award Youth Category.

Besides these, the work and achievements of groups like our Band, Chinese Performance Group, Drama, Choir, Welfare Committee, Social Committee, Gym, Archives, Tech Squad, Lightworks, Yearbook, International Relations Committee, External Relations Committee, Marketing Committee and the Video Production Unit should not be forgotten.

Camille: I tell bad jokes and end up laughing at them myself.



Janus: German Shepherd. Don't think I am either of the other two.






















Eusoff Hall has a tradition of excellence in Flag, and has won the Vice-Chancellor's Shield for the past two years. The onus was thus on us to attempt to bring the shield back for the third time. To ensure success, we put in much hard work, raising funds not merely through the usual calling up of companies to ask for sponsorship, and calling for donations from Eusoffians and the alumni, but also through creative money-making schemes like karang guni sessions etc. We also mapped out the route for Flag Day, so as to maximize the potential returns from our coin collectors. Whilst doing all this, the flaggers also marketed for goods sponsorships so as to give the freshmen and returning seniors a warm welcome back to hall, with matric packs filled with useful products. Our holidays were thus spent making phone calls to potential sponsors, and undertaking various money making projects. The process was tiring, but with the support of our friends and fellow hallmates, we eventually pulled through. The turnout on Flag Day was very heartening. "Snake" was originally a stage play, which at my bequest, the scriptwriter Ng Yi Sheng (currently studying at Columbia University) adapted into a screenplay. From the chinese mythology of Madame White Snake (MWS aka Suzie), the story finds a Singaporean analogue, bridging the late 1970s and modern times. The film is told through the perspective of Shilin, the offspring of Suzie (a snake spirit) and Anthony (a mortal). The modern scenes are highly desaturated (rendered colourless), an expression of Shilin's trapped, sterile mind, as a result of her handicapped condition. The first half of the movie is thus a mix of modern times narration and techni-color flashbacks, an intentional juxtaposition of arid modernity and the colourful vibrant 1970s. This contrast is also perpetuated with the aid of evocative music in the 70s scenes and the absence of music in modern scenes.

Much of the inspiration for the creative concept was drawn from books and magazines. Sourcing for pieces specific to the retro theme was difficult, and having a relatively small budget to split between purchase of costumes and make-up added to the challenge.




The mythical costumes were rented from People's Association for discounted fees because of the bulk rental, and also because a percentage of the film profits were going to charity. In the wedding scene, the extras also had to improvise with their own Halloween suits.

Coincidentally, our sponsor iora, had a collection of pieces that reflected certain retro themes used for the movie. Many of the other pieces used were borrowed from the Hall Productions committee members and associates (parents, friends...), as well as many helpful Eusoffians. Stuff that had to be purchased were all painstakingly bargained for and dug out from the treasure troves of Chinatown.

That SuPing's Vietnamese costume had to be sewn by our resident "seamstresses" HarnNi and Julia. The amazing duo did it in record time due to time constraints, with only one authentic costume to

FIRST LADIES is but the latest in a long line of fine annual stage productions dating back to 1990. Eusoff Hall has always had a tradition of stage excellence since the first production, formerly called Eusoff Concert, and has grown from strength to strength through the years. Together with its new-found corporate image and professional public face, Eusoff Hall's Dance Production has established itself as a *tour de force* on the NUS artistic scene.

FIRST LADIES offered a fusion of two stories told back to back in a seamless and unprecedented display of light, colour, sound, dance, drama, and raw emotion, designed to arouse the senses and provoke the psyche. Combining elements of the stories surrounding Helen of Troy and The Odyssey, the story explored relations between women and their men (with an occasional odd god thrown in). Set in the throes of the Trojan War, the passion of the characters is given true form and grace.

This contemporary version of two timeless tales was portrayed with elegance and a touch of wry humour at a one-night performance at the University Cultural Centre (Hall). The enthralled audience was taken from the calm of home, to the middle of a vicious war fought for the love of one woman, to the difficult struggles of returning to the peace of home and family. The eclectic use of dance and drama furnished these stories with a medium which, by all reviews, succeeded in overwhelming both the aural and visual senses.


2. During the Imprisonment dance, the only thing almost everyone was watching was Sofyan in the cage.








FIRST LADIES.

We didn't want to do Greek. It would have seemed as if we were attempting to duplicate the success of ... And We All Fall Down (DP 2000/2001). We tried to think Japanese. We tried to think of a modern-day storyline. Still, we found that nothing beats the Greeks when it came to malleability. With a Greek story, we always found it easier to blur the boundaries of Time—which is necessary so that we could incorporate more genres of dance.

Helen of Troy and Penelope of Ithaca had amazing parallels between them. The idea of **FIRST LADIES** was to demonstrate the similarities they shared while highlighting the fact that the former deserted her husband and the latter waited for hers to return. One was the cause of the Trojan War and the other, a victim of it.

My inclination towards Grecian storylines is not because I'm especially fond of them. Neil Gaiman (the creator of cult comic series, Sandman) inspired the way I perceive them because in his own works, he demonstrates how ageless the Greek gods, myths and legends are by weaving them into his modern-day stories. He is a good example to follow if you are looking for tips on how to blur Time and Ages.

My tips for Dance Production 2002/2003 are:

- 1. Don't be too eager to try Greek, yet don't develop an allergy for it either.
- 2. Happy endings are nice, but it would also be nice to try one that ends in a macabre fashion.
- 3. Don't do ten dances; we only have one dance studio.
- 4. Don't include me in the final number if I should return to dance.
- 5. And lastly, have fun. Truckloads of it.

The grass patch was transformed into a place aglow with many tiny lights radiating from lanterns of all shapes and sizes hanging from strings criscrossing the field.














The Dance Corps impressed with their graceful "My Sharona" and "Dance of the Dolls", while "Una Dolce" shamed many of us with two left feet.


Commencement Dinner 2001/2002



"I have lost my voice, that's a pain in my throat, but I am happy.



For Auntie and Uncle Yap. Thank you for being so comforting and sensible... and for all the words of encouragement and of course...


for cooking for us! =)



Hall Life has brought me both laughter and sorrow. But whatever it is... it will always be a part of my life that is safely tucked in a corner of my memory.









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
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








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




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
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LAST WORD ...
