



MASTER'S MESSAGE



This is our 15th year on campus. For the hall and for me personally it is a watershed year as I will be stepping down as Master of our beloved Hall at the end of the tenure of my appointment this academic year. The reason for my stepping down is the university's recent policy to limit the tenure of Masters of Halls to a maximum of 10 years. I have been serving as Master of Eusoff Hall for 15 years now, since its inception in June 1988. Having nurtured the Hall since its birth, it is understandably difficult for me to step down. However, I fully understand the rationale of the university administration in limiting tenures of Masters and resident fellows. I also warmly welcome my worthy successor, A/Prof Tan Wee Tin who has many years of experience as a hall resident fellow and Deputy Master. During the transition months of the handover, I am really impressed with his dedication, personableness, industry and generosity. I have no doubt that the Hall is in very good hands. I call upon all Eusoffians and alumni to fully render your support to our new Master and to the next chapter of our beloved Hall.

As is my usual custom, let me first give an overview of the achievements of the Hall over this academic year. We started off extremely well by winning the Chancellor's Shield for Overall Best Performance in Rag and Flag 2002. Among the halls of residence, this is the most coveted challenge trophy. We also won the Best Flag Collection Shield for collecting the highest collection of \$79,000, an outstanding effort given the poor economic climate. As anticipated, our dancers and presenters also won the Best Float Presentation Shield for the Hall. During the year, we staged yet another outstanding dance-drama production called *Evermore* to a packed-to-capacity audience at the University Cultural Centre. It was an adaptation of Alice in Wonderland featuring original songs, music and choreography by our own Eusoffians. The exquisite costumes and stage props were also hand-crafted by Eusoffians. At the same time, all the proceeds of the production were given to charity.


Eusoff Hall also performed well in the sports arena. Both our sportsmen and women came in a very close first runner-up in the annual Inter Hall Games. Our EH Band (Peroxide) came in 2nd Runner Up in the JamX 02/03 annual band competition. While the above are the more visible acknowledgements of our achievements, there are also the unsung heros who have contributed just as significantly in community services in the Eusoff Voluntary Corps. To all of you who have contributed to the achievements of the hall this year, I would like to express my deepest appreciation.

As this will be my last message in the EH Yearbook, I would like to take this opportunity to express my gratitude to the university for giving me this great opportunity to serve as Master of Eusoff Hall. Even though the buildings were new in 1988, in terms of traditions, Eusoff Hall was not new but a continuation of Eusoff College which was founded in 1958 in the old Bukit Timah campus. Yet, on the new Kent Ridge campus, the new Eusoffians have to blaze a pioneering trail and forge a new reputation for themselves. Generation after generation of Eusoffians have given of their best in leadership, creativity, cultural talents, sports prowess, enterprise and adventuring spirit. This has culminated in the string of achievements and firsts which all Eusoffians can be justifiably proud of. There is no space in this short message to adequately describe these achievements but thankfully they are all recorded for us in this and past EH Yearbooks and Eusoff archives. I would like to thank the Editors and the Yearbook Committees of this and past yearbooks and every member of the archives, photographic and video committees for your fine efforts in faithfully and creatively recording the history of Eusoff Hall as it unfolded. Even though the task of writing articles, taking photographs and videos, and archiving them is so behind-the-scenes, yet it is of paramount importance in preserving for us the legacy that our forerunners have left for us year after year.

I wish to express my deepest gratitude to the present and past members of the JCRC, hall leaders, resident fellows and members of the SCRC for your partnership, unfailing support and wonderful contributions over the past 15 years. A TRIBUTE TO PROFESSOR ANDREW TAY...





This afternoon is definitely an eventful day for Eusoff Hall. We have gathered here to pay tribute to a special man who has devoted and given so much of his life to Eusoff Hall. This extraordinary figure is none other than Professor Andrew Tay. He has been closely associated with many cohorts of hall residents, beginning as a Resident Fellow of Dunearn Road Hostel back in 1976. He was subsequently Resident Fellow of Kent Ridge Hall and Vice-Principal of Eusoff College before assuming the responsibility of Master of Eusoff Hall since the hall's inception in 1988.

Over the years, many students and resident fellows have come and gone through the corridors of this our great beloved hall. Yet, Professor Andrew Tay has been around and had seen them all. From the Eusoff College days at the Bukit Timah campus, to its relocation to the Kent Ridge campus, and finally, evolving to become the excellent Hall that it is today. Indeed, under the mastership of Professor Andrew Tay, Eusoff Hall has excelled in so many ways – be it in committee, voluntary & charity, sports, or cultural activities. The "can do" and entrepreneurial spirit is still very much alive and synonymous with Eusoff Hall. No mountain and I dare say, even Mt. Everest, is too high for us to climb and conquer.

As a resident fellow, I am proud to be associated with Eusoff Hall. I am sure all of us in this room can say the same – we are proud to be Eusoffians. Eusoff Hall, as a community, is great not because of physical facilities, but rather, because of its people, its residents. Over the years, I have seen waves of students coming into the hall as freshman, grown to embrace all that is symbolic of the Eusoff spirit and eventually being recognized for their significant contributions each year at the Merit Award Board dinner. I can see quite a number of you, past winners, present leaders, here with us today. Yet, I dare say that none of us can match the level and consistency of Professor Andrew Tay's devotion and service to the Hall. Indeed, he literally embraced the Hall motto, "Excellence and Harmony" to the extent of naming his first son who was born in 1989, Jin-An, after the hall motto.

Working with him in the SCRC, I have known him to be a man of details - he seems to know every nook and corner of this hall. I have never failed to be amazed by his level of enthusiasm and support for the students. He has also shown tremendous patience and belief in the residents. In my five years of working with him, I have never seen him losing his temper or getting angry with the students. He always places the students' interests first. I had gathered this from first-hand experience. In the past few years, I have been involved in several upgrading projects in the Hall – the common areas, the toilets and the coming massive upgrading of the students' rooms. In all the discussions concerning the work plans, Professor Andrew Tay's priority is very clear – the students! The resident fellows' flat and the master flat will only be renovated only if there are surplus funds.

As a boss, I am sure staff members in the Hall office have a lot of good things to say of Professor Andrew Tay. One thing I have observed is that he is a very caring and compassionate superior. Throughout his term, he has never imposed his authority on us. He looks after the interest, welfare and personal development of his staff. I remember when I first joined the university and the Hall, his advice to me then as a young academic was not to neglect my research. Indeed, as an academic, he has been a fantastic role model for me – the ability to devote so much of his time for the students and yet excel as a researcher and teacher.

He is also a good judge of character, a good leader, and a team builder. One thing that has not been obvious, according to an ex-Resident Fellow, but I believe is true is that Eusoff Hall has always been blessed with a committed and cohesive team of Resident Fellows – both in the past and present. They, together with their family members, shared Professor Andrew Tay's commitment with regards to the students' welfare and passion for the Hall. In no small way, I attribute this to the meticulous and careful selection of the Resident Fellows by Professor Andrew Tay.

Even when he steps down from the mastership of Eusoff Hall this coming May, we will always remember his passion and devotion to the Hall. Professor Andrew Tay, you will always have an honorable place in the memory and history of Eusoff Hall. And we are also confident of one thing – you will not forget us. As the saying goes, "Once an Eusoffian, always an Eusoffian!" As a contestant aptly puts it in the recent D&D pageant, "you can take an Eusoffian out of Eusoff Hall, but you can never take Eusoff Hall out of an Eusoffian".

Professor Andrew Tay, words alone cannot represent and express our sincere gratitude to you. On behalf of the staff members of the hall, the SCRC members, current and past residents, we would like to say a big thank you for sharing your life. Your leadership has made a significant impact to the Eusoff Hall community and to us as individuals. Master, we salute you and wish you success in everything that you put your hands and mind to. Just as you have given your time and life so freely to the Hall, may your God in heaven, who sees all the good works and sacrifices that you have done both in public and in private, richly bless you and your family in all ways.

The same lot of people who put a good show, fought the good fight and finished the race – our graduating seniors.


Indeed, Eusoff salutes them and together with our 15th JCRC President, Janus Lim, we thank them "for being there when we needed you most".

Touching the hearts of many with their forthCOMING act depicting a typical day in B4, B block gains top honours in the inter block category.


