

Foreword


Eusoff Hall gets its history from that of Eusoff College. Eusoff College was opened for accommodation in the year 1958, as the first and only university hall of residence for women. The hall was named after the late Dr. Haji Mohammed Eusoff, a member of the Carr-Saunders Committee, as well as the Pro-Chancellor of the then University Malaya at Singapore and the chairman of the University Council from 1953-1957. The first principal of Eusoff College was Dr. Ruth Wong, while the first JCRC President was Miss Ng Kim Lan.

Things began to change when NUS shifted to its current campus in Kent Ridge in 1981. Gone were the days of 5 minutes walk to university for the residents of Eusoff College, replaced by that of long rides to university. All is not lost for construction work on the 5th and 6th halls of residence of NUS at Kent Ridge commenced in 1987, and it was decided that Eusoff College was to move into one of them. However, the name Eusoff College was replaced with Eusoff Hall so as to fall in line with the names of the other NUS halls of residence at Kent Ridge. The new Eusoff Hall was completed in June 1988, and hall operations commenced immediately.

Master's Message

The academic year 2005/06 kicked off with the Hall welcoming its new intake of freshmen as well as its returning seniors to the Hall in July 2005. A total of 212 international students from Malaysia, Thailand, Indonesia, Philippines, Myammar, Vietnam, China, India, Pakistan, Mauritius, Sri Lanka, USA, UK, Germany and Holland joined local Singaporean students for another academic year. In addition, the Hall also welcomed A/Prof Victor Tan as the new Resident Fellow of Block D. Dr Victor Tan is an Associate Professor with the Department of Mathematics and has a strong background in Chinese playwriting and violin music. Since joining us, he has, together with his wife and daughter, demonstrated a passion for the Hall that is worthy of every Eusoffian.

We had a good start when Eusoff Hall won the NUSSU Gold Award for Flag Collection, NUSSU Gold Award for Float, Least Cost Float for Halls of Residence and Chancellor Shield for Overall Champion for Halls of Residence. This is the fourth consecutive year that we have won the Chancellor's overall championship. Although the Hall was not able to retain the Best Coin Collection, our Flag Team has put in tremendous effort by collecting \$50,300 this year for charity.

In the cultural scene, once again Eusoff Hall Dance Production has done us proud when they staged not one but two consecutive nights of superb performance which received rave reviews from invited guests including the Guests of Honour, Dr Balaji Sadasivan, Minister for Information, Communications and the Arts, and Health and Mrs Sadasivan.

In the sports arena, we are very pleased of our sportsmen and sportswomen for bringing home the Inter-Hall Games (IHG) Championship trophies including the Overall Champions Trophy, the Men's Champions and Women's Champions Trophies – all three – for the first time in recent Eusoff history! Although there were very difficult moments, and there still are, it did not diminish the Eusoffian spirit to win!

In the entrepreneurial scene, two companies under our Eusoff Business Incubator (EBI) are faring very well. Gajah International (S) Pte Ltd has expanded their business tremendously, from a 3-man team to 6-man team and has been participating in numerous IT exhibitions and road shows in Singapore and USA. Another EBI company, CashWatch Pte Ltd is also progressing very well, conducting financial education talks and branching out as a tuition service centre.

Overall, I am proud of many achievements made by individual Eusoffian students this year. The most notable achievement was made by Eusoffian Alumni and recent graduate and part time Eusoff Hall office staff, Mr Stefen Chow E-Fung. E-Fung has been one of the final members of the NUS Centennial Team scaling the Mount Everest on 2 June 2005. His adventurous spirit, true grit and great determination during his Mount Everest summit is indeed an inspiration to all Eusoffians. For his bravery and great achievement, the Hall awarded him, the Eusoff Hall Distinguished Achievement Award. The Hall is equally proud of Eusoffian, Chen Huifen for representing Singapore in Netball, in the recent XVIII Commonwealth Games in Melbourne.

Not to be outdone by our student members, the achievements made by the SCRC and staff are also notable. Dr Ho Chee Kong, Resident Fellow of Block B has been appointed as Deputy Master of the Hall recently. He is also the Composer of NUS Song, "NUS Forever". This year, our hall staff have been very active in their participation towards VOICE (Valued Online ideas Contributed by Employees) and won numerous awards including third Prize of the NUS Outstanding VOICE Participation Award. Our Secretary, Ms Rashidah Salleh has been selected by the Ministry of Education, from amongst the ten of thousands of MOE staff, to be awarded the PS21 Star Service Award, the highest national award in the public service for having consistently demonstrated high standards of service excellence in her work.

While I am very proud of your achievements, I am sad to note that we also have a few students who have crossed the line, deliberately or unwittingly, in their studies and in their duties, and subjected themselves to disciplinary action. We must be mindful that in the pursuit of our fervent passion for our beloved Hall, that, however worthy the ends may be, it does not justify the means especially when the means involve breaking rules and the laws of the land. Nonetheless, I wish to express my deep appreciation to all Eusoffians, JCRC, SCRC, Alumni, staff members, sponsors, donors and well wishers who have, in one way or another contributed to the success of the Hall throughout this eventful year.

Finally, I wish to thank Lim Shen Jean and her Publication Committee, and Dr Peter Kew, the RF in charge for their fine effort in capturing the hall activities of yet another outstanding year in Eusoff Hall.

Message From Hall Office

This year, we have completed several upgrading works. As part of the Hall's effort to transform the ground floor of the Communal Hall into Students Activities Hub, the JCRC Room has been relocated to the former Band Room. The Resident Fellow Flats, which are more than 15 years old, have been renovated and are now given a new look! The Hall Office staff who have been very active in their participation towards VOICE (Valued Online Ideas Contributed by Employee), have implemented several suggestions, namely the Eusoff Aquarium which is located at the lobby outside the hall office. Another implementation is the installation of the OSIM massage chair at the upper foyer of the Communal Hall for residents' relaxation. A series of journals such as Reader's Digest, Times and National Geographic have been subscribed and placed on the magazine racks at the hall lobby for residents' reading pleasure. The Hall Office is also in the midst of creating an online IVLE Community for its residents. For their outstanding efforts, Eusoff Hall Office Staff awarded Outstanding VOICE Participation Award (3rd Prize) pm on the NUS Centennial Quality Service Day 2005/06 held on 5 January 2006 at UCC Hall. We are also proud of our Secretary, Ms Rashidah Salleh who was selected by the Ministry of Education to be awarded the PS21 Star Service Awards for delivering excellence and quality service to her customers.

In November 2005, the Hall bid farewell to Mr Narayanan, our security officer of more than 15 years. 




Shean Yann, President

Funkamanja







Scheduling nightmares. Unfortunate episode. Late nights. Hoarse voice. Weight loss. Hmmm...






Our turn finally came and the response was overwhelming. When it all finally ended, I couldn't help but to feel a bit disappointed as I wished the whole event could have lasted longer.


EHOC Programme

Ensoff Expeditions
Project Patchwork 05/06

"Alone we can do so little; together we can do so much..."

Eusoff Expedition had an uphill task this year, especially after Singapore International Foundation(SIF) ceased its administration for Overseas Youth Community Projects. With this the team had no excess to the vast network and channels of SIF. However, based on a strong foundation the pioneer expedition team had enforced and the processes in place, the Team of 05/06 with immense determination proceeded to plan for the trip against the odds. The mission of "to serve and to learn" is pinnacle with regards to our aims and expirations as an expedition team.

The team had decided to return to Prey Veng province in Cambodia and in December, a recce trip was conducted by the three heads. Our host in Cambodia is a lady by the name of Bee Ngoh. A Singaporean missionary who has been working in the rural areas of Cambodia for 12 years, she has mastered the local language and has acquired the respect of the locals, Bee Ngoh is truely a remarkable lady. With her company the heads visited 4 villages and finally decided to work with Kampong Chan village. The local village school with an infrastructure of only 5 classrooms and 12 teachers serves as the only educational institution to 2 adjacent villages, some 700 students. A classroom or two was in crucial need.

With the plan in place, the fundraising campaign was launched, beginning with the charity movie screening of the movie 'Goal' at Eng Wah cinemas. The event was a huge success. Not only did we manage to sell full house but it was also the first event the team had organized together. Other fund-raising activities were planned, such as the Bazaar and notebook sales. In October 2006, the team applied for an Overseas Youth Project grant from the National Youth Council (NYC) and was awarded the grant in April. This boosted our fund-raising efforts and the team was in full swing preparing for the trip.

Spending 18 days together in a foreign land with 29 other individuals can be an arduous task. Hence the team embarked on a team bonding trip to Berkelah Waterfalls in December 05, as we ploughed our way up the treacherous path we got to know each other better. The fact that it rained overnight at the summit, meant everyone huddling up in tents to battle the icy winds and rain. Doubt any of the team members will forget that night anytime soon.

As we believe in making every trip as enriching as possible, for both our team members and the Cambodia children. The team has planned a whole list of programs for the Cambodian children. Be it educational classes, a mini-amazing race or even a food festival, interaction with the locals is guaranteed. Also though we are doing service work overseas, we wish to do some service in Singapore as well. We believe that by working with young children here, we can encourage the sprit of giving and sharing and expose them to volunteerism. Though they are still young, but hopefully through our interaction with them, the videos they see and the experiences we share, we might spark off a flame of volunteerism that might grow in the future when they do become of age. Hence we continued the collaboration for a cultural exchange between Maha Bodhi school and the Kampong Chan village school in Prey Veng. The wonderful primary students from Maha Bodhi painted some 700 t-shirts. Each class was armed with a theme, and with that theme they were given the freedom to express themselves in their paintings. The students also donated 300 school bags and a plethora of stationary. The t-shirts, school bags and stationary will be shipped up to Cambodia and will be presented to the Cambodian children.

Much of the work has been done... and the team is ready. There are numerous people we would like to thank and are extremely grateful for their support.
















Interview with SMRT President

In a bright and sunny day of Singapore we were advancing in the MRT towards City Hall headed for the SMRT Head Offices to interview the SMRT Chief Executive Officer. Yes so many confusing things in just one sentence, this is what Ms Saw Phaik Hwa is all about. And if you try to list her accomplishments in one sentence, well think again 'cause your readers are bound to be confused. She will leave you all dazzled up with her charming charismatic personality.

After reaching the Head Office and being cleared at the Security check we were greeted by the smiling face of Ms Dawn Low, Senior Manager of Media and Publicity, another Alumni of NUS FASS. As we waited, I saw a person in a very simplistic outfit, rushing through the waiting room and headed to her office, when interrupted in the midst and introductions were made. If you want to know how to be successful, Ms Saw is your guideline. If you wana know how to overcome the hardships of the life in front of you, go to Ms Saw.Or do you want to know what Eusoff Hall and its life is all about?

Life In Eusoff

"Eusoff was good times, 1974 about 32 years ago when I entered this College. A long time ago and it was a very memorable time. In fact the times in Eusoff College in many ways was more memorable than the times in NUS. NUS gave me a degree but it was Eusoff that taught me what it means to fight in life." Ms Saw said while describing the life in Eusoff College.

"Everywhere you have to win, every game you play you must win and if you don't do it they'll chop off your head", this was the in-short key to survival in the Eusoff College. "Even when we played netball with guys, I mean it's difficult for us to beat guys in this, but then the spirit to win was still there. So we would pull the pants of guys, jump on them and basically do anything, just to win. The tradition of Eusoff College is mental mentoring and its spirit to teach you the level of independence, to do almost anything, to strive on your own and to want to excel and this was particularly important for women of that day because there were still a lot of prejudices against women but 100

Ms Saw says that the basic thing that Eusoff taught was that it allowed women to come forward and lead. She also states that she was disappointed when she went to one the anniversary dinners at Eusoff and saw all the boys leading. What happened to the spirit of the girls, the spirit which Eusoff College was all about? The girls were only second to guys. According to Ms Saw, Eusoff taught all women to be equal and there is no need to sexy, take a subservient role or attract the guys. There is no need to have all these social norms. Just do what you are good at and you will be recognized. This gives you the confidence because if you are good you can do it. And it

won't say one is more than the other. Education has become more common to everyone. You can read how much you want but, still, the challenges prevailing are the same for everyone: To succeed is just as tough, there simply is no difference in any way. During the old days, most of the jobs required you to have a recommendation; today you can apply for a job almost anywhere but this doesn't mean that the difficulties have reduced, they are still the same." Regarding women on the same subject, she pointed out that prejudices against them have reduced a lot. A lot of jobs, which in those days were reserved only for men, are now open to women as well, although the latter still face many challenges on her way to the top.

One of the most treasured achievements of Ms Saw that stands above all the rest is that she has constantly served and acquired positions that were occupied previously by men only. "I have never gone in (to a company) worried that I was a woman, I guess this is what Eusoff taught me, to be unaware of my gender. Eusoff College gives you the confidence to deliver based on your capabilities. It gives that to you as a gift, the notion that you are a person and, everything else, whether it is color, race, gender or whatever, is irrelevant and you'll just have

to do what's best. Eusoff builds you a very strong character (where) you never regard yourself as weak just because you are a woman. Nevertheless, later on in life when I look back, I realize that there were indeed a lot of prejudices but I'd always remained quite oblivious to them. I will just do what I can do in the best way possible. I've never tried to be one of the boys. I am not concerned about learning things that guys like because I am simply not interested. For example, even when I am talking to you guys now, I do not have to go and learn what guys like to have a meaningful conversation. To me, that would not be a meaningful conversation. If you use your energy to do what really matters and counts, eventually you will convince everyone that you are the best. Certainly there are prejudices, but that doesn't mean you'll have to succumb to them. I myself have lived through them. There are many transitions in life that one will have to cross, but it doesn't mean that you'll have to give up. Sometimes you'll just have to make the best out of what life is offering. You have to fight to win".

Her Meal In Turkey

Having said all that, there is one incident that sums up the character of Ms Saw. This particular

incident occurred while she was having dinner in a seafood restaurant for a change, having spent days feasting on chicken. Being mindful of Turkish culture where patrons pay the price stated on the bill without first perusing it, Ms Saw simply paid the bill and left after having an enjoyable dinner. However, a few blocks away from the restaurant, Ms Saw and her friends realized that the bill was exorbitant even in the context of Singapore's living standards. They then decided to return to the restaurant to check the bill. However, their reentry to the restaurant was blocked by an employee at the door. Being the feisty, daring lady that she was, Ms Saw slipped under his arms and made her way to the counter to demand an explanation. Not wanting to cause a commotion, and realizing that Ms Saw was not a person to be pushed around, a waiter then brought her to the cloak room and returned her the money.

What we can see from this is a strong independent individual who is fearless and stands by her principles. Her Best Quality

According to her, the best quality that one of her initial supervisors pointed out was that she would never give up when faced with a problem. If a problem was encountered, she would try her best to solve it instead of merely presenting the problem without doing anything. "It's not a very big quality I know, but back in those days it was a big thing because a lot of people complained at that time. A lot of people liked to complain but I like to challenge a problem".

Ms Saw, who has groundings in Biochemistry, now stands tall among the best in the glamorous corporate world of Singapore. When asked about her change of discipline, she

replied, "I like the scientific subjects, to be honest. It may also have been the indoctrination. In those days the best students went for science and the people who could not get into science joined the arts. The way I like to think and the way I perceive is more in a scientific manner than anything else. Actually, I believe that both going to science and joining the retailing business were fate more than anything else." Fate or not, she has risen to be one of the leaders of Singapore, exemplifying what persistence and sheer hard work can achieve.

Advice To The Youth

When asked for her advice to the youth, she said, with a smile, "I don't want to sound like a grandmother but I think that the youth today are very intelligent. To them, gaining and accessing knowledge is not a problem. But one thing I see is that youngsters now wish to jump to a good life without wanting to going through what is necessary to achieve that life. They want to reap the rewards without working hard, but this will not happen. You'll have to face life and not succumb to its difficulties. It is only then you can succeed."

Ms Saw has achieved in a short time what most people would need a lifetime to acquire. Most importantly, she is content with what she has achieved. She is a pertinent example of how success can be achieved as a result of constant, dedicated hard work. I would like to end this article with a quote from Ms Saw with regards to risks in life:

"Take risks because sometimes the lower the risk, the lower the return and the higher the risk, the mightier will be its reward."

Interview With Ms San Phaik Hwa:

A Reflection

It isn't always that you have the opportunity to meet and interview some of the more powerful people in this country. The people movers, and Singapore shakers, as I would term them, play a vital role in the seamless running of this country. Therefore, when I was offered the chance to accompany our writer to interview Ms. Saw Phaik Hwa, I jumped at the opportunity (actually I was forced to go by my dear friend and head Jean) But boy, was I glad that I went for the interview! I was able to learn a lot from Ms Saw, most of which you wouldn't be able to learn from textbooks or lectures.

On first impression, Ms Saw would certainly blend well with a group of youths, dancing away with her spiky hair and youthful zest. One would even mistake her for a 20 something year old, fresh out of college, from the level of enthusiasm that she has. However, don't let her youthful face fool you as the lady behind that face is certainly far from being inexperienced and carefree. Behind the youthful exuberance lies an individual with immense talent and wisdom, having been a leader from the days of her youth till today, where she is the CEO of one of the most well-run train system in the world.

It was quite interesting interviewing Ms Saw about her days in Eusoff College. She first entered EC back in 1974 when it was still an all girls hostel. One of the incidences that still remain fresh in Ms Saw's mind is how they laid an ambush on the neighboring guy's hostel after having had their clothing stolen in a 'panty raid' by the same guys. They waited silently outside the male dorms during the night and created a ruckus to get all the guys to come out. When they do, the guys will find water bombs raining on them. The next day, when questioned by their principal, the girls would all act angelic and deny all knowledge of any wrongdoings.

Eusoff College at that time was already a vibrant residence, having an annual production not unlike our Dance Production today. From the little snippets of information I was able to gather, Ms Saw was an all rounder even in her younger days, being the JCRC President in 1975. She was also the hockey captain as well as a photographer for the publications team, our predecessor. At that time, Eusoff College instilled a spirit of independence in the girls,

teaching them that there were no boundaries and that discrimination did not exist in the College. As a result, instead of having subservient roles, the girls were able to rise up to the occasion. Indeed, as mentioned by Vice Chancellor Kwan in Eusoff College's 1976 yearbook, "The Eusoff College girls have something extra mirrored in their faces: a sense of being masters of their own fate, a confidence in what the future holds."

It is this spirit that Ms Saw took with her in her life's journey. Not realizing the presence of the proverbial glass ceilings all around, she chose to excel in life and to give it her best shot instead of allowing others to beat her back into submission. In doing that, she broke those very glass ceilings, rising to positions previously completely dominated by males. In doing so, she has become a role model for everyone, be it male or female, that we shall never allow our circumstances to dictate our fates. Ms. Saw is the first female to take the helm of SMRT and has performed with gusto and pride to the best of her ability.

Throughout the interview, Ms Saw exudes an aura of confidence and strong personal beliefs, one I hope that all Eusoffians are able to achieve as well. The spirit of Eusoff has and will remain the same in the past or in the future. It is our dedication to Excellence and Harmony that allows us to walk ahead with great strides and heads held high.

To Ms. Saw, I thank you for sharing your experience with us, and being an embodiment of the Eusoff spirit; for being a role model to all of us, showing us that we are who we are, and that limitations are not of what society imposes on us, but rather of what we are willing to accept of society. May SMRT grow through leaps and bounds under your leadership and we are certainly proud to have you as one of us.

To my fellow Eusoffians, let's emulate the examples set forth by our elders and seniors. Who knows, perhaps in 30 years time, history will repeat itself and we may find our president Sheau Yann being interviewed by an overtly enthusiastic 20 year old from Eusoff Hall.

for the support you two have given me over the past two years.






