# Message from Master

Another year has passed. We started off the academic year with a series of activities lined up by the Orientation Committee to welcome the freshmen and returning seniors in July 2006. In order to facilitate easy reference and guidance to the freshmen, for the thrid time a Freshmen Guide has been published, an outstanding effort taken by the Eusoff Hall Orientation Committee (Program Team).





# Message from Hall Office

After the successful completion of upgrading works for residential blocks, Hall Office and Resident Fellows' Flats, the Hall is now focusing to renovate the facilities in the Communal Hall under its Phase III upgrading. This is to ensure that Eusoff Hall is up to parity with all the facilities of other Halls. The Hall has submitted the upgrading proposal and is currently awaiting approval from the University Management to go ahead with the renovation. We hope the upgrading works will be completed in time for the Eusoff Anniversary Celebrations (Eusoff College 50th & Eusoff Hall 20th) in 2008. The preparation for the Eusoff Anniversary Celebrations, 2008 has also started with the formation of the Commemorative Editorial Book Committee. Several major programmes are also in the pipeline for the celebrations. To further enhance the hall security system, more closed circuit cameras have been installed in Block A, C and D. The Hall will also be installing the Simon-Voss protected gates and fences at strategic locations. Another enhancement that Eusoffians should look forward to in the near future is for Eusoff Hall to go completely WIFI.

To the JCRC, especially my dear boss VJ, thanks so so much for all the support you've given. You've been absolutely mad.



# **EUSOFF VOLUNTARY CORPS - ELDERLY**

The Eusoff Voluntary Corps (Elderly Service) is a voluntary organization working to promote and support effective community volunteerism and involvement among Eusoff Hall Residents. The EVC-Elderly group came about several years ago through the effort of some senior Eusoffians who felt the urge to perform community service and they chose to help elderly Singaporeans, Today, EVC-Elderly is actively involved in helping the elderly community around the Chin Swee area. Every year, EVC-Elderly delivers 2,000 packets of food to these elderly folks and spends almost 1,300 man-hours volunteering in the Chin Swee area, far exceeding the minimum 60-hour quota that NUS has set as its annual target for student volunteers.

EVC-Elderly's main purpose is to bring hope to shattered lives by offering these individuals their friendship, offering a weekly meal to those in need, and to build understanding and care between the young and old. These elderly persons are supported materially by various other organizations. However, many of them have no next-of kin or have no one to care for them, and many of these old folks live alone. EVC-Elderly's weekly visits make a real and tangible difference in their lives.

Contributions in the form of food donations from vendors in the NUS canteens are sent weekly to the elderly. Beside this, the volunteers also help to fix faulty in the homes they visit like replacing light bulbs, tightening loose taps and so on. Helping immobile elders spring-clean their homes to make it more comfortable and hygienic, helps to cheer them up. Weekly household chores like sweeping, mopping and grocery shopping are done without fail to ensure their continued comfort and convenience.

EVC-Elderly also lends an ear to hear their grievances, their complaints of pain and even their reminiscences of their past glories. Often our volunteers are the only people that these elderly are able to converse with and these sessions helps give emotional and mental support to the old folks. There is a close rapport between the volunteers and elders which gives them something to look forward to on our visit.

Recently, EVC-Elderly has begun to look into the health and well-being of the elderly folks in our care. Volunteers give advice to the elderly on how to take care of their general health and hygiene. EVC-Elderly have also started to encourage these elderly folks to have regular heath checks at the nearest polyclinic. Our volunteers







would accompany the old folks to the polyclinics to seek medical attention. We also follow up on the referrals made by the medical authorities to ensure adequate medical attention given to these elders. In case of minor injuries like cuts and bruises, medical aid is provided like proper dressings and wound management.

The EVC-Elderly service has been caring for elderly folks over the last few years. They often go beyond the scope of their responsibilities. Early this year when one of the elderly folks passed away without any next-of-kin, the EVC-Elderly group interviewed people and talked to different social organisations before they tracked down

the church this man attended and helped them arrange for a decent and proper funeral as a final dignity for someone who had become their friend.

EVC-Elderly volunteers go about touching the lives of these elderly folk without fanfare and without complaint. What is most remarkable about our team of volunteers, apart from their tremendous generosity and self-sacrifice, almost of them are international students who put their hearts and soul, into helping Singaporeans in areat need.

# YOUTH SERVICE-LEARNING AWARD 2007

The Eusoffian spirit of volunteerism is flying high and many are following in the footsteps of Johann Annuar and Stefen Chow E-Fung from Class of 2004 to be caring, daring and to make a difference. Johann is the communications officer for the first Singapore Mt Everest Expedition in 1998 and also a participant of the first Singapore Transcontinental Cycling Expedition 2003/2004 while Stefen is a member of NUS Centennial Everest Expedition Team 2005.

Johann and Stefen are just two of many Eusoffians that have made significant contributions. Jane Lee and Sim Yihui are members of the Singapore Women's Everest Team to summit Mustagh Ata (7,546m) in China. This is part of their training for their attempt to conquer Mount Everest in 2008. Their expedition in July made them the first all-women team in Singapore to summit a 7,000m mountain.

Eusoffians are also given the opportunity to take volunteerism beyond Singapore through the Eusoff Expeditions Committee, which was established in 2004. The Expeditions team is made up of several enthusiasts who start their planning and fund-raising very early in the academic year. In May 2005, Eusoff Expeditions set off to Cambodia for their maiden expedition for 18 days. During which, they built a classroom among other activities as part of their community service. In May 2006, the Expeditions Team raised funds for another mission to help school children in Village Chan of Prey Veng Province in Cambodia. This won them the 2006 Student Achievement Award.

All these activities are amongst the many that are organized by Eusoffians. We will be looking forward to more exciting and meaningful contributions by Eusoffians in this coming year and the years ahead, raising the volunteerism spirit in Eusoff to a new height.

Last but not least, the tears that flowed on the morning we were leaving. Tears that best epitomize the bond formed between the villagers and us.






































# RD-HOE




























"Winning is not everything, but the effort to win is." – Zig Ziglar



CPG looks forward to a fresh year - one of fresh new talents and of wonderful performances!


















# DANCE CORPS














# BADMINTON GUYS

Gold, and nothing but. Given the strong netball tradition in Eusoff, most have come to expect a great deal from our golden girls, and year after year, they have never failed to deliver.



All in all, it has been a good IHG season for the netballers, having secured yet another netball gold with a victory against rivals Temasek, amidst the emergence of promising new players.







Let's hope ERC will continue to spread the name of Eusoff Hall to all!





committee members to ensure that members are not overworked and that the equipment are used efficiently. Much care was also placed on the maintenance of the equipment to maximize the investment put into them.











EVC also known as Eusoff Voluntary Corps is one of the committees in hall which deals with social and community work. EVC opens up opportunities for all Eusoffians to have a taste of what community service is and not to mention providing exposure.

This year, we have four voluntary groups in the care of EVC namely, the Salvation Army, MINDS, NUH and the Elderly service.

The Salvation Army service basically involves our volunteers giving tuition to the children at the Salvation Army centre. Many of these children are neglected and thus, our volunteers play a major role in caring and nurturing these children.

The MINDS service deals with the mentally challenged and our volunteers are sent out also on a weekly basis to interact and to befriend them. Our volunteers play an essential role to guide them in learning basic living skills. Some of these clients are relatively slow in learning. Therefore it is crucial for our volunteers to practice patience to teach and to guide them.

Another service under the care of EVC is the NUH service. We are currently allocated to Ward 55 at NUH. Most of these patients suffer from kidney failure and are under going renal dialysis. This treatment would indeed cause them to be very weak. Our volunteers would then attend to their necessary needs such as serving food and water to them. Befriending them through a little chatting would also be a large part of what these volunteers do as these patients spend most of their time in the ward with nothing much to do.

Last but not least, we have our Elderly Service. This service would be rather unique as we are independent of any external organization. Many of the old folks at York Hill live in poor conditions and many stay alone without having anyone to look after them. Our volunteers have been helping out some of these folks in various ways from cleaning their house to bringing them to hospitals for their regular check up. This service has existed for many years now and certainly many more to come.

EVC truly have touched the lives of many and with the guidance of our new Resident Fellow. Dr. Mark Emmanuel, I believe that EVC would certainly reach greater heights in the near future.

# SPECIAL FEATURE: DR JOHN SEQUEIRA


