



Message from Master

A/Prof Tan Tin Wee Master, Eusoff Hall

The year 2008 marks an important milestone for Eusoff College and for Eusoff Hall for it is the 50th Anniversary of our founding half a century ago!

In 1958, a group of young ladies entered the portals of Eusoff College as pioneering students of the then University of Malaya in Singapore at Bukit Timah Campus.

Twenty years later, in 1978, a pioneering branch of Eusoff College, set up operations as the Nassim Wing of the College in the vacated building of the old Raffles Hall, at Bukit Timah Campus, and later moved into Kent Ridge to establish Eusoff Hall as a sister hostel of Eusoff College.

Eusoff College and Eusoff Hall coexisted in Excellence and Harmony till the new millennium when in 2001, Eusoff College was closed to tearful memories of those same pioneering ladies. Parts of the foundations and artefacts of Eusoff College were moved to Eusoff Hall to signify the baton that is now transferred, and the responsibility that rests solely on the Hall and the legacy we inherited. As we cross into the celebration year 2008/2009, we, Eusoffians of the old College, Eusoffians of the Alumni Association, and Eusoffians of today stand shoulder to shoulder, in marking the 50th Anniversary of our collective journey through a tremendous 50 years of Singaporean history and indeed, of the world. Message from Hall Office

This year, we are pleased to announce that Eusoff Hall received a donation of \$50,000 from Ngee Ann Kongsi to establish a Eusoff-Ngee Kongsi Student Assistance Fund, of which \$15,000 has been channeled to our Eusoff Bursary Fund. The Eusoff Ngee Kongsi Student Assistance Fund will provide flexible financial aid to students who are in severe financial difficulties due to unforeseen circumstances or who are disadvantaged. On the other hand, Eusoff Bursary will provide students from low-income households to alleviate the financial burden of hall fees. Eligible residents are, therefore, encouraged to approach the Hall Office to make further enquires and apply for either the Eusoff Bursary or Eusoff Ngee Kongsi Student Assistance Fund.

On a separate note, the Hall Master, Associate Professor Tan Tin Wee has been appointed a panel member of the Interactive and Digital Media Expert Group (IDM EG) of the Media Development Agency. He was also awarded the ASEAN Science & Technology Meritorious Service Award in recognition for his efforts and significant contributions towards the promotion and development of regional cooperation in the scientific and technological fields, and the upgrading of the regional, scientific and technological capabilities in Singapore. Congratulations to our Hall Master, Assoc. Professor Tan Tin Wee!

Also receiving accolades for her years of dedicated service was Office Staff member, Madam Wong, who was awarded the 2007 National Day Long Service Medal. We offer her our heartfelt congratulations as well.

The Office is also pleased to report on improvements to sections of the Hall that were completed over the May/July vacation period at the end of the academic year. The renovations saw the acoustics of both the Function Hall and the Dining Hall enhanced significantly, in addition to the re-orientation of the Function Hall stage. 


Yellow Subs, Eusoff Hall English Drama committee, has once again done a great job. Halloween 2007 saw a modification from the year

The Eusoff Voluntary Corp (EVC) carries on the REVC tradition established in 1968. In 1997, the EVC made a commitment to visit and provide practical help to residents living in one-room flats in the Outram area. This has become a longstanding arrangement and today, Eusoffians make weekly visits to 19 elderly people in the area, bringing with them food and good cheer. It now includes a Health Management Programme, which the Hall generously funds, to ensure that these elderly have access to badly needed medical care. The EVC has been recognised for its immense contribution to society by numerous awards including the prestigious NUS Student Achievement Award 2007. Through their efforts, these young Eusoffians have enabled some of the most disadvantaged individuals in our society to live with dignity.

These efforts at social service do not stop at home. Eusoff Expeditions was established in 2004 by Grace Koh, and has since burgeoned into an annual expedition to Cambodia to help the children of Prey Veng province. Each year the team wins funding from the National Youth Council for their exemplary efforts, and also received the NUS Student Achievement Award in 2006.



EVC Honoured

Eusoff Hall's Voluntary Corp (EVC) - a voluntary organisation that provides service programmes benefiting the aged, the mentally disabled and underprivileged children - has recently received recognition for the fine services that it has rendered over the years.

EVC Elderly Service was conferred the NUS Student Achievement Award on 26 October 2007 and EVC MINDS (Movement for the Intellectually Disabled of Singapore) was honoured with the Outstanding Contributor Award, during the MINDS 45th Anniversary Gala Dinner, held on 24 Aug.

EVC-Elderly service has been caring for elderly folk over the last few years and is currently assisting the elderly community residing in the Chin Swee Road area, near Chinatown.

Under the scheme, volunteers from Eusoff Hall visit these elderly residents on a weekly basis, delivering meals, and rendering services ranging from making minor repairs and performing household chores to accompanying them for their medical checkups. Perhaps more importantly, EVC's volunteers develop a close kinship and understanding with the aged folk whom they visit, providing much appreciated companionship and empathy to many souls who have lost most of their friends and family.

Students involved in EVC MINDS (Movement for the Intellectually Disable of Singapore) spend hours assisting MINDS trainers in carrying out their training programs. The volunteers also interact with their clients, ensuring their safety and serving them food and drinks, and assist in maintaining the cleanliness of the centre.

About Eusoff Expeditions

Eusoff Expeditions Committee was set up in 2004 to give our residents the opportunity to bring service learning and the spirit of volunteerism beyond the local boundaries to neighbouring countries in the ASEAN region.

The themes of Service Learning, volunteerism, leadership and adventure are cornerstones in Eusoff Expeditions. Our members acquire personal, team and leadership skills, as well as develop a stronger appreciation of the overseas partner community's culture and socioeconomic development issues. Each expedition lasts about 18 days but the Team takes more than 6 months to prepare for their expedition and raise funds.

The first Eusoff Expeditions Team was set up in 2005 and her maiden project under the name of "Project Barefoot". On top of building a classroom, the Expeditions Team conducted various activities in the course of their 18 days in Cambodia. Besides the time that was spent daily playing with the children, teaching them English and learning Khmer from them, the Team also conducted a food festival where they whipped up dishes from their tiny kitchen and showcased some of Singapore's local dishes to the villagers of Tnal Chay, encouraging cultural interaction at the same time. The Team also organized a sports day and arts and crafts session for the children. A movie screening was also screened for the entire village on the local temple grounds where about 100 odd children from the village packed the temple hall for this rare treat.

Encouraged by the immense feeling of fulfilment, Eusoff Expeditions Team took up the challenge again to embark on a second project "Project Patchwork" to build a classroom for the school children in Kampong Chan Village, which is also situated in Prey Veng Province, Cambodia.

In May 2007, Eusoff Expeditions successfully carried out their mission "Project D.A.Y.S to Cambodia where they extended help to build a library for the schoolchildren in the Chan Village. The Team also helped to dig a well for water sources for the village.

This year, our Eusoff Expeditions Team embarked on another trip to Cambodia in May 2008 and after a careful reconnaissance trip, chose to secure water supply and build sanitation facilities for the villagers in Kampong Sleang, in Prey Veng Province.

Besides connecting NUS with the Cambodian villagers, the Eusoff Expeditions Team has been collaborating with Singapore's Maha Bodhi Primary School for a stationery collection drive and T-Shirts painting as part of the cultural exchanges between the schools in Singapore and Cambodia. The T-shirts and stationery are packed as gifts by our expeditioners and given to the Cambodian school children to promote peer interaction across cultures.

In May 2006, the Eusoff Expeditions Team was awarded the NUS Student Achievement Award 2006 for their outstanding contributions towards community service. The Eusoff Expeditions was also featured in the campus Newsletter "Knowledge Enterprise" in November 2006 issue in recognition of their outstanding effort, dedication and commitment in making a difference in the lives of the Cambodian children.

Project Heartrock

The Eusoff Expeditions team embarked on their annual trip to Cambodia for community work and service-learning on 20th May 2008. This year marked a mini watershed as we did not return to the village of the previous two years. Instead, we went to Village Sleang, a village that has not experienced any foreign aid. Over there, we constructed 8 wells and 7 toilets, fundamentals to improving their standard of living. In addition, we engaged the villagers in activities like a food culture exchange and a photo exhibition on Singapore life.

Wells and toilets were not too difficult to build, but we initially felt more of a hindrance than a help. The skilled and experienced workers could do what we did in half the time. Seemingly simple things like laying bricks and operating a fairly primitive machine suddenly morphed into rocket science when we tried our hands at it. However as we went on to our third and fourth wells/toilets, our proficiency level definitely increased. This was ascertained by the fact that the workers were no longer laughing at us or frantically stopping us after every brick we laid.

Interaction with the villagers went beyond planned activities, as the warm and hospitable people occasionally invited us over to their houses for hedonistic feasts of dog meat and rice wine. Some may cringe at the idea of adorable little dogs made into meals, but well, it tasted great - like beef redang to be exact. (It does not matter if dogs are cute. We are sure some people find cows and fishes cute but devour them anyway.) The host family also whipped up a great tasting broth called 'bobo porridge' especially for us a couple of times.

The children there were an explosive bundle of joy and energy, outlasting us most of the time in whatever we did together. They brought us to the lakes where sampans cut out of tree trunks provided endless hours of entertainment - the children's very own brand of 'water-sports'. The language barrier counted for nothing, as friendships and bonds were still established between the kids and us. Our driver/guide/translator/friend, Tola, also taught us a new game of Boules, which






got most of the team hooked. It was a simple, relaxing game that was nevertheless challenging. Nights were spent playing bridge, writing diaries and having heart-to-heart talks with one another. The guys had the luxury of bathing under moonlight and the stars, while the girls bathed under fluorescent light and lizards/insects in the cubicles. On the very last night, the villagers held a feast for us in appreciation of our work in Village Sleang. Despite their poverty, the villagers were not afraid to share their generosity with us, offering us a meal that most of them cannot afford, even on a monthly basis. Our hard work during the course of the year, the hours spent toiling under the sun building wells and toilets were definitely vindicated when one villager stepped up to give a thank-you speech. Each one of us could see his sincere and heartfelt gratitude, how much he appreciated us being there, his umpteen utterances of 'thank-you-very-much'. It was a poignantly touching moment, forever etched in our memories.

A Zoukout-esque 'party' concluded our expedition trip, as the villagers blasted music from a rented sound system. Everyone, including the villagers and children, danced the night away. The trip may have ended, but hopefully, the friendships have just begun.






















Through singing together in Eusoff Choir, we have forged a strong bond amongst us because we all love singing!








Volleyball Guys




















Publications

All in all, it has been a busy and exciting year for the Student Affairs Committee of AY 2007/2008.


























Best lah! Blazing barracuda lah!!






Describe a typical day in your life as a Eusoffian.




