message from master

This academic year 2008/2009 has been a significant year for Eusoff Hall. As the 50th Anniversary Year of Eusoff, many celebratory events were organized to mark the occasion. The celebrations kicked off on August 8th, 2008, with a Reunion Lunch at Evans Lodge at the Bukit Timah Campus, which was the former premises of Eusoff College. It was truly heartwarming to see more than seventy ladies of Eusoff College, some of whom traveled from abroad to be at the celebrations, gather to walk the ground and reminisce about days gone by in Eusoff College. Adjourning for lunch at the old dining room, now the Wine Company, the ladies were grateful to see that the old flooring had been preserved, and it was no surprise when they were moved to sing some of their songs from the Eusoff repertoire. Later that evening, as the main highlight of the year-long celebrations, we held the 50th Anniversary Gala Dinner at the banquet guildhall of the NUS Society's Kent Ridge Guildhouse, sited within the newly built Alumni complex. More than three hundred Eusoffians including Guests of Honour, Dr Tony Tan Keng Yam and Mrs Mary Tan, herself a Eusoffian, celebrated this joyous occasion with our new NUS President, Professor Tan Chorh Chuan and Provost, Professor Tan Eng Chye and their spouses. Eusoffian Alumni at the Gala Dinner pledged a total of \$27,000 as donations towards the Eusoff Bursary Fund.

The finale of our anniversary was marked with the internment of the 50th Anniversary Time Capsule Ceremony on 26 March 2009, which was officiated by the former Principals of Eusoff College, Dr Lim Kiat Boey and Professor Lee Kok Onn; former Master of Eusoff Hall, Professor Andrew Tay and Datin Ragayah Eusoff, the daughter of Dato Haji Mohammad Eusoff, after whom our College and Hall are named. I was very privileged and honoured to be part of this great occasion to celebrate the outstanding work and achievements made by Eusoffians through the years.

During the academic year, Eusoffians continued to demonstrate our passion, talent and prowess in many areas. Led by the EHOC team when term started, our Eusoff float was selected to participate in the Chingay 2009. In the sporting arena, Eusoff Hall won the Inaugural Dean of Students' Challenge Trophy as Overall Interhall Games Champions. We also won the Men's Championship Trophy and our Ladies took overall second place. With this win, on our 50th Anniversary Year, Eusoff Hall has won the Men's Championship and the Overall IHG Championship for four and two consecutive years respectively.

In the cultural scene, our Dance Production once again staged a spectacular production entitled "You've Got a Friend in Me" to an appreciative audience including the Guest of Honour, RADM Lui Tuck Yew, Senior Minister of State for Education, Information, Communications and the Arts. Not to be outdone was our Eusoff Film team, who after a half-decade hiatus, managed to surprise us with an original short film entitled "The Forgotten", produced by a group of dedicated Eusoffians. I am also very pleased that our Eusoff Bands continued to perform at their best. The prominent ones included B Sharps who won the Talent Quest 2009 and, Sixology, who won several competitions including the National Stardust Band competition and the Yamaha Asian Beat 2008 Band Championships in Singapore. Sixology was selected to represent Singapore to compete with champions from other Asian countries at the Grand Championships at the Jockey Club Auditorium in Hong Kong.

In community service, our members of Eusoff Expedition continued their journey to Cambodia for a fifth time, to carry out "Project Hopscotch", which built more sanitation facilities for the villagers of Kampong Sleang. Meanwhile Eusoff Voluntary Corps continued to press forward with their exemplary community service to old folks at the Chin Swee Road area. They also provided basic health screening under the new Health Management Plan to identify potential health issues for the elderly in that area. The EVC also provided tuition at the Salvation Army Children's home in Pasir Panjang for underprivileged children. For their efforts, the university nominated Eusoff Hall for the President of Singapore's Social Service Award. I am proud to announce that the Hall was one of three shortlisted finalists for the award, which received honorable mention at the ceremony at the Istana in 2009.

The 21st JCRC achieved a significant milestone when they initiated a new programme to groom student leaders. This culminated in a two-day student leaders' retreat at the Costa Sands Resort which successfully met their objective to develop stronger leadership qualities in Eusoff Hall leaders and where outgoing and incoming student leaders forged stronger bonds with one another. The student leaders' retreat saw the inauguration of an annual Workplan meeting as part of an integrated programme to develop practices of good governance in the students' management of the Hall's busy activity schedule. The retreat also allowed student leaders time to think and work together towards a common vision of excellence and harmony in our University community which is in line with one of our Hall niche areas, "The People ~ Nurturing of Leaders and Trailblazers".

Another significant milestone was the implementation of the Hall Academic Enrichment Module which was initiated by NUS Provost, Professor Tan Eng Chye, as part of an effort to create an academic component to balance the rich diversity of hall activities currently in place. Focusing on "Community Service and Social Entrepreneurship", a series of four workshops received a good response from Eusoffians. The Hall has also planned regular talks by our own SCRC members as well as lectures by external guests such as Nobel Laureate Professor Robert Huber, who has kindly agreed to kick off our inaugural Eusoff Lecture series on September 9th, 2009. This marked the first major item of academic year 2009/10 as we look forward to another glorious 50 years. Also deserving special mention is our EusoffWorks Team who continue to provide excellent service to the

How time flies! It's time for us to wrap up for the academic year 2008/09.

This year Eusoff turned fifty and it was an eventful year for all of us at Eusoff Hall to celebrate the Jubilee anniversary. The highlights of the celebrations were the Reunion Lunch and Anniversary Gala Dinner held on 8 August 2008. More than seventy Eusoffian ladies from different era arrived from different parts of the world to attend the Reunion Lunch @ Evans Lodge, the former premises of Eusoff College at Evans Road. Prior to lunch, Eusoffians walked through the grounds to reminisce their great memories of life in the college. In the evening, Dr. Tony Tan and Mrs. Mary Tan who were the Guests of Honour, together with more than three hundred guests, attended the Anniversary Gala Dinner held at the Kent Ridge Guild House.

This year also saw the Hall carried out the Phase 3 of its upgrading works to renovate the Communal Hall including the Dining and Function Halls, Heritage Corner, Master's Office and Master's Residence. The Seminar Room, Board Room and Reading Room were also equipped with projectors and AV system for the Hall to conduct classes and workshops as part of its implementation of academic modules this year. Four series of workshops for Eusoff Hall's Academic Module "Community Work and Social Entrepreneurship" were conducted successfully with more than thirty students attended each session. This initiative was part of the pilot teaching scheme in preparation for the University Town Residential Colleges come 2010.

The Eusoff Hall Expedition Team embarked on their maiden trip to Cambodia in 2005 to work with the villagers in Tnal Cheay Village. Since then, Eusoff Expedition teams have made yearly visits to different villages in the Prey Veng province: Project Barefoot in 2005, Project Patchwork in 2006, Project D.A.Y.S in 2007, Project Heartrock in 2008 and most recently, Project Hopscotch in 2009, which marks the 5th year of their involvement in Cambodia.

Project Hopscotch embarked on its journey on 18th May 2009. The 2 weeks spent in Village Sleang offered new perspectives to many of our members. Initially, some experienced culture shocks at the level of poverty witnessed there, while others were thrown out of their comfort zones. Aside from on-site manual assistance that the Eusoff Expedition team provides during construction, they also conduct enrichment lessons for the children in the respective communities.







We were, in short, truly disappointed. There were no words for it. There is nothing much left to be said. The results were final. We accept what is on the paper. But let us not forget the journey we have



A particular scene involving the two lead actors faces meeting really close to one another seemed to get the loudest cheers.
























sports director


I am proud to have served this fantastic group of people during my term as Sports Director, and I hope that I did my best to give all of you something memorable to remember about Eusoff Hall.

To the road-relay girls: I love you very much <3, judith




All in all, our 2009 IHG softball campaign was one hell of a rollercoaster ride that I will always remember when I look back at my stay in Eusoff Hall.














Tennisguys




I would like to take this opportunity to thank the team for the great commitment they showed for the team and it was an honor for me to captain this team of "CHAMPIONS".



Elderly Service Division

Every Saturday morning, members of the ES Division faithfully deliver packed lunches to the elderly folks at Chin Swee Road and perform household chores like washing and cleaning if necessary. The EVC members also lend a listening ear whenever possible.

I) Health Management Programme (HMP)

A brainchild of Andrew Hong, the HMP was initiated in 2007 to monitor the health status of the elderly under the care of the ES Division. Under the HMP, routine health checks for blood pressure and blood glucose levels are conducted on a monthly basis to alert EVC as to when extra medical checkups may be required.

2) Annual Chinese New Year Dinner

The Chinese New Year Dinner was held in appreciation of the longstanding support from the Arts Canteen sponsors who take turns to provide lunch for the elderly. The Chinese New Year Dinner was graced by Prof Tan Tin Wee (Master, Eusoff Hall) and Dr Mark Emmanuel (EVC Advisor). The elderly folks were also invited to the dinner to spread the festive cheer in welcoming the Chinese New Year, and goodies were also specially prepared for the elderly as part of the celebration.

EVC (Salvation Army Division)

Members of the SA Division visit the Haven at Pasir Panjang Road on Tuesdays and Wednesdays to provide tuition to the children at the Salvation Army. The EVC members also serve as advisors and counselors to the on matters like cultivating good study habits.

I) NUS Chinese Dance Performance

10 Salvation Army children, accompanied by several EVC members, were invited to attend a performance by the NUS Chinese Dance in September. This outing was organised as a breather from school for some of the Salvation Army children who were not having major exams.

2) Post-Exam Party

In November, Salvation Army children who had passed their examinations were rewarded to a post-exam party organised by the EVC members, in recognition of their hard work and success at the school examinations. During the party, KFC was ordered on top of the catered food, and many games were played. The Salvation Army children expressed their gratitude to their EVC tutors by giving each of the EVC members home-baked chocolate cookies and fruit cake.

All in all, community service has had a long-held tradition in Eusoff Hall. The EVC volunteers, with tremendous generosity and self-sacrifice, have enabled some of the most disadvantaged individuals in the society to lead life a little better.

Secretariat




