The academic year 2011/2012 has been a great year for Eusoff.

This year's welcome of our new intake of freshmen as well as our returning seniors to the Hall in July 2011 started with a range of interesting activities including safety and wellness talks to exploring campus facilities in the Treasure Hunt, thanks to the Programme Team of our Eusoff Hall Orientation Committee (EHOC). Not to be outdone, our Flag Team put in a great effort and raised a total of \$34,000 on the NUS Flag Day. For the first time ever in the history of the Halls of Residence, as approved by OSA and NUSSU, none of the Halls were competing with each other during Rag Day which was held off-campus at the Marina Bay Promontory in conjunction with the National Day Parade.

Instead halls were paired to build a combined float. Due to proximity and operational convenience, Eusoff Hall was partnered with our neighbouring Temasek Hall to build a combined float and leverage on each other's strength. It was thrilling that our combined spectacular float was selected to participate in the increasingly international Chingay Parade 2012. I am glad that Eusoff Hall residents have formed a refreshingly wonderful camaraderie with Temasek Hall in both activities, notwithstanding our traditional rivalry in the sporting arena.


In the cultural scene, once again Eusoff Hall Dance Production has done us proud when they staged a superb performance which received rave reviews from invited guests including the Guest of Honour, Mr Desmond Lee Ti-Seng, Honourable Member of Parliament (Jurong GRC). This year, DP incorporated a new element in its production with the involvement of the A Cappella group as part of its performance. Our other cultural committees were also active in their events with Choir performing at the Amplitude and Eusoff Bands at the annual Rockfest.

In the sports arena, our sportsmen and sportswomen once again has done us proud to clinch the Dean of Students' Challenge Trophy for Overall IHG Champions at the Inter-Hall Games 2011/12 and the Men's Championship Trophy, with our Ladies, in the overall second place. With this win, Eusoff Hall has won Men's Championship for seven consecutive years (2006-2012) and Overall IHG Championship for five consecutive years (2008-2012).

In community service, Eusoffians continue their noble cause in helping the less fortunate through the Eusoff Voluntary Corps and Eusoff Expedition. I applaud members of EVC who are so committed and dedicated to their weekly visit to the elderly folks in the Chin Swee Road and providing tuition to the kids at the Salvation Army. At the international level, our Eusoff Expedition Team continued their journey to Cambodia for a seventh time to carry out their "Project Kaleidoscope" which built sanitation facilities and secured water supply for the villagers of Prey Onquin Village of Prey Veng Province, Cambodia. I am very proud and happy that their unstinting selfless commitment towards community work was recognized when both our Eusoff Voluntary Corps and Eusoff Expeditions won the NUS Student Achievement Award 2012. Our very own Lynette Tan, Vice President of JCRC clinched the individual trophy for her distinguished personal accomplishments with Sports Director Teo Jia Kai, receiving a certificate for his commendable achievements, and the overall JCRC of 2010/11 receiving due recognition as well for Rag and Flag. It was certainly a big sweep of awards at the grand Award Ceremony held at the UCC.

Our ties with our very own Eusoff Alumni Association was regularly renewed, as they had been very active. Collaborative programmes with the Hall such as "Eusoff Connect" and "Eusoff All Stars!" were organized with great enthusiasm. 





Eusoff Expedition 2010/2011 "Project Kaleidoscope" 9 May to 26 May 2011




NUS Alumni Leaders Forum








Eusoff Inaugural Night Cycling 14 Oct 2011










3rd Annual Eusoff Lecture "Welcome to Success" by Dr R. Theyvendran, PBM.




Student Achievements and Awards


NUS Alumni Leaders Forum 8 0ct 2011


Eusoff Hall's Residential Learning and Training Programme

Eusoff Hall has established a Residential Learning and Training Programme which is incorporated to upgrade our current Hall Enrichment Programme and to complement the various yearly cycle of student activities. Our central aims in implementing the Eusoff Hall Residential Learning and Training Programme are to create learning, training and leadership programmes for residents to enhance their intellectual vigour, self-confidence, and well-rounded development besides inculcating a community spirit amongst residents. These visions are in line with the legacy of a strong culture of excellence, professionalism, and intellectualism at Eusoff Hall.

The Eusoff Hall's Residential Learning and Training Programme is incorporated using the OSA's Student Development Framework whereby the learning objectives, learning outcomes and evaluations of learning programmes are captured and reflected. The Learning and Training Programme is coordinated by a team of 3 staff who are housed at the Residential Learning and Alumni Centre located in Level 2 of the Communal Block.

The Residential Life & Alumni Centre (ReLAC) is an initiative of Eusoff Hall with the mission to focus on personal development and learning programmes to enhance Eusoffians and Alumni life skills. The objective of such programmes is to equip Eusoffians with adequate skills to enable them to plug into society when they leave NUS. As acquiring skills is a life-long learning, the centre will also extend its learning to Eusoff alumni to enable them to continuously upgrade their interest and skills in society.

The renovation of the centre has been completed in October 2011. The ReLAC team is now operating in the newly renovated office located on the 2nd floor of Eusoff Hall Communal Block, together with a group of student leaders and Eusoff Alumni Association whom they are working closely with.
















Eusoff Voluntary Corps (EVC) Headed by Michelle Wong



EVC is currently one of the biggest committees in Eusoff Hall with around 80 members working hand-in-hand. There are three programmes under EVC, namely Elderly Service (ES), Salvation Army (SA), and MINDS. There is also a Project Team which handles ad-hoc events and sponsorships.

Elderly Service

EVC Elderly Service (ES) team is actively involved in supporting the elderly community around Chin Swee Road, both physically and emotionally. Other than delivering food to them on every Saturday, we help the needy elderly, especially those with mobility difficulties, to do household chores and to buy groceries.

Besides that, projects such as the Health Management Programme and Grant-a-Wish Project were also carried out to ensure that the health conditions of the elderly are well cared for and their material needs are fulfilled. Events such as Mid-Autumn Festival and Chinese New Year dinner were carried out to ensure that the elderly were not left out during festive occasions.

This year, we managed to get Bengawan Solo to sponsor mooncakes for the elderly. We also managed to get Community Integration Fund (CIF) from National Integration Council to fund the Chinese New Year dinner. Furthermore, we have been listed as one of the seven charities that will benefit from the "Birthday donations" on Ms. Catherine Lim's 70th birthday, which falls on 23rd March 2012.

Salvation Army

EVC Salvation Army (SA) team is involved in giving tuition to the children at the Salvation Army Centre, The Haven on every Tuesday and Wednesday. Our members are paired up with the children on one-to-one basis so that the children can get undivided attention from our members during the tutoring sessions.

Besides giving tuition, SA also organizes a post-exam party at the West Coast Park to reward the children for their hard work throughout the year. This year, the gifts for the children are funded by 'Drink Tea' Bubble Tea Sale, which was carried out by SA Team during Social Awareness Week. And starting from this year, we have made Sports Session, a session in which our Eusoff sportsmen teach the children some basic floorball techniques, one of our official events.

MINDS

EVC Movement for Intellectually Disabled of Singapore (MINDS) programme is a weekly service programme in which members will visit Clementi Training and Development Center (CTDC) to be friend and interact with the clients in that center. Other than weekly services, EVC MINDS also organizes events in collaboration with MINDS CTDC to raise funds and awareness for MINDS CTDC.

This year, MINDS set up a booth in Eusoff Hall to sell handicrafts made by clients in CTDC during Social Awareness Week in October. Our members also helped with the preparation work for the MINDS Concert which was held on 14th and 15th of October at Republic Polytechnic.

Overall

EVC's excellent and outstanding accomplishment in community projects was recognized when we received the NUS Student Achievement Award 2011 earlier in February 2011. This year, EVC has again received the same award at the Award Presentation Ceremony held on 17 February 2012.

- To encourage personal learning and development in all our members through constant sharing among team members and small-team reflection sessions, as well as discussions regarding social issues.














Basketball

I would like to thank my level heads for stepping up and helping me out. I really appreciate all your help guys and I hope you have enjoyed being in A Block!








