

MASTER'S MESSAGE

A MESSAGE FROM ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR **TAN TIN WEE,** OUR HALL MASTER OF 2003–2013.

As I pen the last Year Book message as Hall Master of Eusoff, it would have been a few months more than ten years since I stepped into this wonderful institution.

Planned in part by the previous founding Master Professor Andrew Tay, I presided over a period of extensive renovations to the Hall, from the lovely red tiles on the roofs to match our red brick buildings, to the interior decor of our living quarters to the revitalised facilities which we now enjoy. Over the next six months before I step down I will continue to explore other aspects of upgrading and renovations for the Hall to stand us in good stead for another decade of exciting developments and transformation of residential life at NUS.

In traditions like Rag and Flag, and Orientation, we have participated to the fullest, culminating in three consecutive years of being selected for Chingay where our Rag and Performance teams have

reached international standards in float building and dance performance. Dance Production every year without fail, continues into its third decade as a public performance and gala extravaganza now annualy held at the University Cultural Centre (UCC) auditorium. The Merit Awards Dinner (MAB) turned into a glitzy Eusoff awards night; D&D was converted into smaller scale and less costly Bashes with Pageant incorporated; three highly successful consecutive years of Eusoff Fiesta, a day of funfare run by Eusoffians for Eusoffians. Of course in the sports arena, Eusoffians continue our unbeaten track record of six consecutive years as the Overall Champions in the Inter-Hall Games. We may not always be champions in every sport, and often as underdogs, we have come back from behind our ever improving competitors to clinch the Men's Overall Championship for seven consecutive years at one stage and of late the Ladies' Overall Champions. Our secret is this, that every single individual in every team we fielded, did their part to be the best with whatever talent, training and toil they could muster up. The keenly contested games meant that if any team slackened, we would have lost the precious one or two points needed for overall victory; therefore for every game, every Eusoffian sportsman and sportswoman gave their all.

In 2008, we combined the 50th Anniversary of the founding of Eusoff College at Evans Road in the Bukit Timah Campus, with celebrations of the 20th year since a branch of Eusoffians led by Professor Andrew Tay, incubated for a couple of terms at the nearby Raffles Building as the Nassim Wing, marched into our present day Eusoff Hall. Our Anniversary Gala Dinner held at the NUS Guildhouse, lit the place up with the lovely smiles of Eusoffians from far and wide. with a huge cake cutting presided by our current President Dr Tony Tan and First Lady Mary Chee. his ebullient Eusoffian wife. With great gusto, our President to be at the time, regaled us with stories of his frequent visits to an all-girls college that Eusoff was back then in the fifties and sixties, and how the top girl of Eusoff College came to be his bride.

For our time capsule ceremony we had the honour of welcoming Datin Ragayah, the daughter of Dato Dr Haji Mohd Eusoff, the late Pro-Chancellor of the University of Malaya in Singapore whom our Hall is named after, to grace the occasion. As part of the culmination of our celebrations, and now into our 5th consecutive year, we became the first Hall to inaugurate an annual lecture series, our Eusoff Lecture, with a Nobel Laureate in Chemistry, Professor Robert Huber on 9th September 2009.

Since the Anniversary Celebrations, we have also sought to rejuvenate the Eusoff Alumni Association. The last few years has progressively seen the recruitment of our alumni into our Senior Common

Room Committee as Non-Resident Fellows, including the former JCRC Presidents of Eusoff College and Eusoff Hall namely Saw Phaik Hwa (EC 18th JCRC), Francis Xavier (EC 28th JCRC), Gregory Vijayendran (EH 2nd & 3rd JCRC).

Past Eusoff Hall student leaders have now populated the leadership of the Alumni Association while Eusoffian leaders of the Senior Alumni of NUS Rosemary Khoo, Lim Bee Lum, Alice Seng and others steered and ran a very successful "Our Singapore Conversation" with Minister Heng Swee Keat in our Eusoff 55th Anniversary this year.

We look back at the second and third decade of our continuing contributions to community engagement, with our Eusoff Voluntary Corps expanding our regular food delivery and elderly visitation outreach at Chin Swee on Saturdays (the traditional Elderly Service) to include tuition service for kids at Salvation Army home at Pasir Panjang as well as adding cheer to children at the MINDS home in Clementi.

Soon we will solidify our early efforts at a social entrepreneurship enrichment module in the past few years into hopefully a teaching module incorporating the lessons learnt from our nine annual expeditions to villages in the Prey Veng Province of Cambodia into an international service learning course module. To me it was in a twinkling of an eye since the day Eusoffian Grace Koh put up a paper in 2004 proposing a brave plan to partner Love Cambodia to create Eusoff Expeditions, vetted by none other than Deputy Vice Chancellor Varaprasad.

In adventure, we were not to be outdone. Eusoffian Stefen Chow became the first NUS team to summit Mount Everest in 2005, as part of the NUS Centennial Everest team. Not to be left behind, the two intrepid

Eusoffian women adventurers Jane Lee and Sim Yi Hui, rallied to form the Singapore Women's Everest team, summitting Everest in 2009 after raising several million dollars in sponsorship all by themselves. Jane Lee went on to summit all the highest peaks in seven continents in a truly remarkable feat (the Seven Summits), while Stefen went on to become a National Geographic photographer.

Our business incubator, the longest running and by now the only surviving hall incubator, has seen six companies being nurtured ranging from modest fledging catering and tuition businesses to highly publicised and successful IT companies like Give.sg and Gajah International.

In culture, A Cappella, Elixer, internationally awarded Bands, Choir, Dance, Drama and Eusoff Films formed the anchor of our cultural groups. Our love for music and performance is truly contagious.

The office has a fresh team led by Rashidah, who will have received her BBA by the time this book is published. She succeeds Steven Mok as Hall Manager who has been with us since the very inception of Eusoff Hall in Kent Ridge campus. A new team of RFs has also stepped up; for the first time a new slate from the outstanding team I had inherited from Andrew Tay. Notably, Ho Chee Kong has been promoted from Deputy Hall Master of Eusoff to Raffles Hall's Mastership; Peter Kew has gone on to be an Associate Director of NUS Environmental Research Institute (NERI); Joseph Ooi has gone on to win the NUS Best Educator Award in 2012; John Sequeira has become the Principal Economist at the Monetary Authority of Singapore; and Leung Ka Hin served with distinction as Deputy Hall Master at Eusoff. My deepest thanks goes out to all of them who taught me valuable lessons in life. I had sought to change Eusoff Hall

for the better when I arrived ten years ago, but now Eusoff and Eusoffians have changed me and are still changing me for the better. They have transformed any regrets I have into apologies, and from apologies into fresh new hope for the future. I feel I have grown up a lot in Eusoff Hall.

This year, being my last tour of duty, I will get to feel the same kind of emotions every graduating senior and every departing resident feels... the nostalgia and sentimental thoughts of closing a truly memorable chapter of our lives, probably the best ever, some say. My children grew up in Eusoff, my long suffering wife has never known a matrimonial home of our own, for we have made Eusoff Hall that home, just as generations of Eusoffians have made it their home away from home. It was here that they had the best times of their lives, found their soul mates, and met up with friends to join their journey in life. Interwoven with the thousands of threads of their lives, it became their Eusoffian destiny, bearing the distinctive Eusoffian spirit, espousing the challenge of our motto to pursue Excellence and Harmony always in whatever our calling may be.

As I leave these hallowed portals, I look back with Eusoffians of old with pride of achievement no doubt, but more precious were the friendships forged and enemies reconciled, and shared memories of the ups and downs of life we went through together, that formed the ties that will forever bind us as Eusoffians. As we face the future of uncertainties ahead, I stand as equals with every one who has lived the Eusoff experience, marching forward shoulder to shoulder, having lived life to the fullest, and yet, still knowing the best is yet to be, for once a Eusoffian, forever a Eusoffian!



DANCE PRODUCTION

I remembered the time when Yi Shun and Wilfred came up to me one day and wanted to "meet". I knew what was going on back then; Xavier had already been hunting me down for weeks for this Drama Director role after seeing me do stuff in one of the cheesy plays written by Koon Hui. I had in mind what the answer would be and through that short meeting (brief brief HAHA!), but I just had to play the poker face of pretending not to know what was being said. Coincidentally, of the five people, there were four with no drama background and surprisingly only one danced in last year's production. Maybe the numbers 'four' and 'one' are the numbers for this year's play. Anyway, this bunch—Dickson, Fatz, Wen Jia, Matthias, Kiral —should look back at how they have been doing throughout. As I have always said, if your fellow actors or dancers remember the lines you say on stage that's half the job done, because you have caught their attention in the first place. And the logic goes on; if your dancers remember them, the audience remembers them. To some of you whose lines were written to have the desired effect and made the dancers go wild, good job and I hope this stays with you. To those who didn't, that's just poor luck. But then again, that's life right? Luck sometimes just trumps choice.

To the sets team, I'm really thankful for Jue Ying's presence. The most amazing thing about him is that he's just too reliable. He acts like one smiling around even when things went wrong. He works like one—the just do, see how later kind. Wow. I recalled the moment when we were just throwing off ideas randomly and at one time I thought that putting the stairs would have other implications on the show and I think he told me something like, say first, specifications can come later.

To the rest of the sets team, I was heartened to find

that some had worked in places where we got the wood from, some did all the labour without much complain and others just made up with the speedy runs on and off stage. Really, I never thought they would be that proactive, and those people gave me pleasant surprises.

The next group that I want to thank the most is the Logs (Logistics) team headed by Kai Min. These group tend to be overlooked so many times because no one recognises their existence, even if they were the ones who chose to bring all the goodie goods to everyone. In fact I was quilty of doing that one moment when I suggested (in a more direct tone) out loud "since the logs are not doing anything now, why not ask for their help in making fake food?" Sorry logs team, I made you guys do more than what you could have expected yourselves to do. With the results that came out, I thought it was good considering you guys (Jon in particular) put in your creativity and effort into those pastries, fondue-looking cake with Jueying's ball of light sticks and the big-ass chicken. It goes to show, creativity doesn't just limit itself to designers, actors and dancers, right? So yeah, thanks Logistics!

To Yaling, you are just too zai in getting everything since day one. DAY ONE. That's just how ZAI you were. 'Nuff said.

But yes, for all the pressure on D-Day and the bump in days before that I think they are made of steel to be able to let me play with the light cues and the effects along with it. Yes, thanks for the moments when we were about to murder you but we didn't, as well as the times when you guys took the initiative to look out for cues yourselves. It's a huge dilemma to think of SM and what should be done, but somehow you guys just did it. Thanks again.

The ASMs' dedication was obvious during the bump-in days with all the observations and props making and note-taking drills to ensure things go well. Before that she was still in her "should I go for class should I not" mood where we just bossed her around as if there was no tomorrow. Technically not bossing; we were just fighting for time for ourselves. But on that day she took the reins herself and started giving deadlines to our use of the stage. Every time when there are new audience I always tell my cast in advance, because performers are performers; new and interesting elements are the ones that keep them motivated to want to wow you. So Thank You, you have made me want to do DP even more.

Looking back at what happened since May and the process of it, I'm still in shock and euphoria at how I could get my hands on quite a huge pie of the tens of thousands spent for this year's production.

RAG

Describe RAG.

I believe RAG is a time for people to bond and get to know each other better no matter where we come from or what languages we speak. The name of the float this year La Camarada was named with the intention of the true purpose of RAG.

What has been RAG's greatest challenges?

It would have to be the lack of local students joining RAG. With so many opportunities out there and people wanting to pretty up their resumes, it has become even harder over the years to encourage students to join RAG. In addition, students are paying for their own meals and hostel fees during the vacation despite the lack of subsidies. Therefore, it would seem that the costs outweigh the benefits for anyone looking to join RAG each year.

Ask any of the "older" raggers and they will tell you stories of why they joined RAG—It was all about maintaining something called hall pride. It also used to be so much more challenging, with students having to come up with manual mechanisms and none of the work was ever outsourced. It really challenged the creativity of students then as compared to the past couple of

years. NUSSU had however implemented a no outsourcing rule this year and it really challenged the committee members on how they could create the moving parts you see on the float.

What has been RAG's greatest achievements?

Despite not taking away any trophies during the RAG & Flag this year, I believe that our greatest achievements this year would definitely be the opportunity to perform for the Chingay parade once again. In addition, the raggers were able to look at the float with pride and say to themselves that despite not winning anything, we did our best and that our float was the best that day.

I think one other achievement that we managed was to finish up the float at the date that we planned for (about 1 week before RAG day), which meant that we did not have to rush the night before and had more time to ourselves to bond, have fun and enjoy the remaining days till RAG day itself.

Anything interesting about the RAG committee?

The most vivid memory that I have would be one of the first few nights that we started to work late and that was also when the team started to really bond together. All of us were in the RAG room massproducing one of the detailings and we didn't leave the room doors or windows open. This sounds a little wrong... but let me continue.

We were working with the yellow/contact glue in the room and everyone was basically sniffing it throughout the few hours we were working to finish as much as possible. Now, if you know any of the side effects of glue sniffing, it would have to be getting high and that was what happened exactly. Everyone started laughing, some for no reason, and talking really loudly. We were basically really high despite the late hours and it was a good start to a bond that formed amongst all the committee members.

Tell us something that most do not know.

I guess what most people see about RAG is all the hard work that everyone puts in and they wonder why people waste time doing it—labeling it "sai kang". I would not disagree that it would seem like a waste of time, but the real fruits of our labor comes from the bond that you form with the rest of the members involved with the project.

This is the ONLY NUS event that brings people together for almost three full months. Check out any other CCA or hall committee that you have and you will realize that you would not spend as much

time with them as you would if you were involved with RAG. With that being said, this is also where I met some of my greatest friends and people I could trust.

Most people would only view RAG from an external point of view, but never notice the intangibles, which far outweigh the costs of the work put in. I believe that only until one has gone through RAG can they truly understand the RAG experience, which is also the feeling that brings raggers back each year, passing the torch and wanting more.

How have you benefitted from your experiences in the RAG committee?

Given that this is a joint-project between two halls, I have definitely benefited a whole lot being able to see how each hall's JCRC does things differently and how each hall can improve itself to make the experience of each hostelite a greater one. It has definitely been a very humbling experience for myself and those that I have worked with, and I must say that we will always be able to learn from those around us no matter whether they may seem better or not as good as us.

CHINGAY

Tell us what your committee does.

We are mainly made up of Engineers, Detailers and Wardrobers. Engineers and detailers work on the float while wardrobers work on costume. For Chingay 2013, our dragon float from Rag will be displayed in full glamour after upgrading and touch-up. Meanwhile the wardrobe department makes everything from costume design to hand props and face paint for the performers. Besides these three groups, we also have our float designer, dance choreographers, administrators and lastly the comm heads. Eusoff is taking part in her 3rd consecutive Chingay Parade 'Fire in Snow' on 22 and 23 February 2013 and the committee has been preparing hard for it since Semester 1.

In Semester 1, the comm heads, designers, choreographers and administrators begin work in the planning stage. The float designer plans the upgrading of the float and costume designers draw their plans for costume. Dance choreographers plan a 3-min long performance for 150 performers. The comm heads liaise with People's Association for the performance concept and the external contractor for float construction, as well as begin recruitment for committee members and dancers.

The administrators source for sponsorship and provide administrative support to the heads.

During the December vacation, we start mass production for our float and costume. Dancers go through training sessions and numerous rehearsals at F1 Pit Building until Parade Day. Our work brings us out of NUS often: to the F1 Pit Building where our float is situated to put on our detailing after mass production; to the People's Association HQ for meetings, and to nicks and crannies of Singapore in search of materials and sponsors.

Everyone works tirelessly and the combined team effort is what will make our performance dazzle on Parade Day. But all this preparation for Chingay does not culminate and end in a one-off two-day event. Rather, the spirit of Chingay lies in the journey itself, with friends and fun amidst daily challenges.

If you had to describe your committee in three words, what would they be?

'Bunch of Talents'. But the committee is so much more than that and these,

three words are hardly enough.

Tell us something that most people do not know about your committee. This is the second year that Eusoff and Temasek Hall are joining hands to take part in Chingay. It is a unique committee where collaboration instead of competition is embraced and friends across halls are made. Committee members and dancers consist of Eusoffians and Temasekians and the whole project will involve close to 200 residents.

Has the committee changed over the past semester?

We have definitely become more bonded over the December vacation. We learn to accept one another's working styles and build on one another's skill sets and talents. We help one another however we can; everyone pitches in to improve the float, dance and costume. It is tedious work but I hope that by the end of the journey, Chingay will mean something special to each and everyone in the committee.

How have you benefited from your experiences in the committee?

Chingay has let me understand myself better; how I deal with problems, with people, with myself. Chingay has moulded me to become very resourceful, to think out of the box for solutions, learn to tap on my team mates' skills and knowledge. Even though I am heading this committee, everyday I find myself asking tons of questions to my designers, engineers, detailers... I find that the one who knows the least is myself. And with each question, I also see our float, dance, costume and friendships progress every day, and it gives me a sense of immense pride. Chingay is where you learn very practical skills (like learning that turpentine can save a tin of hardened paint, that yellow glue doesn't really work on shoe soles, that scissors and penknife cut CCB better than cutters); it is where you discover friends that last a lifetime.

Share with us some memorable moments in your committee.

After extensive exposure to various materials, corrugated card board has been renamed CCB, paint has been named emulsion or enamel, yellow glue has become 支芽糖, and we all strive to achieve the Ee Hwee-style in commendation of our chief engineer Ee Hwee.










































3 25TH JCRC


What tips or advice, if any, would you give to next year's team?

I love you girls and I'm very proud and happy to have trained and played alongside with all of you :)



I'd also like to take this chance to congratulate the girls team for clinching the girls title for the second consecutive year; first year led by Wan Yi, this year by Sarah.




What was the hardest match of the season?






What tips or advice, if any, would you give to next year's team?


What tips or advice, if any, would you give to next year's team?




Any words you would like to give to your team?

What were EVC's greatest challenges?

We had guite a bit of a restructure in one of our wing's focus. EVC consists of four major wings: Salvation Army, Elderly Services, MINDS and the Special Projects Wing. Whilst Salvation Army, Elderly Services and MINDS work towards directly providing a service to our beneficiaries, SPW worked rather indirectly. Previously the main portfolio of SPW was to assist the other wings with their special calendar events. But we decided to change their focus and direction from this year onwards. We wanted to build a wing that would serve to provide different platforms of volunteerism for Eusoffians to be engaged in. By doing so, we hope that we can impart a spirit of volunteerism in the Hall. This is something new for me, and for the team; we all started from scratch. I guess I could say that this was one of the challenges for our committee this year. But I'm glad to have a vibrant bunch of passionate members for this year's SPW. We're working towards big things and I do have faith in them that it'll pull through.

We are also looking into expanding our service outreach, in particular, the Elderly Services wing. The Elderly Services wing is our one wing that works autonomously without a partner community service body, which means that the elderly we take care of are sought by us and not referred to by an external community service body. Thus it is by our own effort that we find and interview elderly who are in need of our assistance. We hope to add more elderly to our service as we see that we have the capacity to do so.

Share with us some memorable moments.

I think a major highlight of the work that we do here is to be able to see the smiles on our beneficiaries' faces. As cliché as it may sound, it really is an overwhelming experience to realise that the work you do has an impact on the lives of our clients. I recall a time when I went to tutor at the Salvation Army. As our tutees came down for their tuition, one of the children, upon seeing her tutor's face, beamed up so brightly as she then ran to embrace her tutor. Till this day, that moment has left a strong impression on me.

On another occasion, we fetched one of our elderly who was hospitalized to come back home and celebrate Mid-Autumn Festival with the rest of the elderly during our annual Mid Autumn Festival Celebrations at Chin Swee Road. Helping to get him out of the cab and onto his wheelchair at Chin Swee Road was an overwhelming experience for me. It was a long time since most of us have seen uncle, and it was great to have him back with us, though only for a short while to join in on the festivities.

Tell us something that most do not know.

Our vision and mission can be encompassed into 'Every Volunteer Counts' as every small bit of effort from anyone can go a long way towards impacting lives for the better. Our vision is to build a Hall of community-centered Eusoffians with a strong spirit and willingness to help their fellow man.

How have you benefited from your experiences?

I've always wanted to do community service work but never had much chances back home. One of the factors that attracted me to join Eusoff Hall was because of Eusoff Voluntary Corps and the work they do. Thus, I think by being a part of this experience on its own was a benefit and a blessing. To be able to meet individuals with a passion for helping others, and to work with them towards a common cause; the experience amounts for itself.

How have you benefited from your experiences?







What have been your SPT's greatest achievements?



A: Even if A Block falls, we fall like a seed to germinate but not like a leaf to die!


Q: What are Block A's most distinguishable traits?

Q: Share with us some interesting facts about your Block.



Q: Any memorable moments to share?



A: Everyone in E Block is a big Eater!


Q. Share with us some memorable or funny moments.
