MASTER'S MESSAGE

I am pleased to sum up activities and developments for Academic Year (AY) 2013/14. It was an eventful year with major changes at the hall. Firstly, there was a change in Master-ship as well as faculty and staff composition. I took over as the new Master as from 2nd January 2014 following the completion of A/P Tan Tin Wee's tenyear old term as Master. At the same time, the hall saw the departure of Prof Adekunle Adeyeye, the Resident Fellow of Block E, as he went on to become the Master for Ridge View Residential College, a new residential college to be set up on Kent Ridge Campus. In turn, the hall welcomed Dr Lee Chian Chau as the new Resident Fellow of Block C.

At the office front, we saw the retirement of Mr Lim Siew Poon alongside the recruitment of three new staff: Nisha, Abidah and Maryann.

As a means of summing up the AY, let me highlight important, meaningful and new events at the hall. I shall begin with major events. On November 15, 2013, students, colleagues and alumni came together to give a warm send-off to A/P Tan and his family. Soon after the festivities of the New Year, on 6th February, the hall held its annual Eusoff Alumni Reunion Dinner. During this event, the Eusoff 55th Anniversary Book, entitled, "Keeping the Torch Ablaze" was

launched alongside a donation drive for the 55th Eusoff Anniversary Bursary. The establishment of a bursary to commemorate Eusoff's 55th Anniversary is aimed at providing an additional resource for residents who require financial support.

As in the past, the hall had its share of meaningful achievements last year. The Eusoff Green Committee did the hall proud when it won the AY2013/14 Inter-Hall Environmental Award - an award which was conferred by NUS President during NUS Excellence Day on 19 February. The annual Dance Production was another resounding success. Coinciding with Valentine's Day, this AY's drama and dance production, appropriately titled "Love is a Place", vowed its audience. The performance received many accolades from external SCRC members, guests and friends. The DP Team had pushed excellence a notch higher through their amazing performance.

In the IHG games, Eusoff lost its championship title and took the second runners-up spot. Despite this slip in position, what's heartening was that Eusoffians lived up to the spirit of our IHG motto for the year to "Never Back Down!" Our athletes displayed great discipline and integrity throughout all matches. Not surprisingly, the Sportsman of the Year award (a new award given by the Convening Hall this year) was won by a Eusoffian.

Another meaningful event was the EVC's Chinese New Year lunch for the elderly at the Red Star Restaurant on 22nd February 2014. Apart from lucky draws and gifts - made possible by the fundraising efforts of the EVC Team - the elderly were especially treated to a lion dance. The hall is deeply prideful of the pirit of voluntarism among Eusoffians where tudents are mindful about the less fortunate in our society and willingly sacrifice their time each week to render service to the elderly, orphans and mentally challenged communities.

Besides the usual year-round activities, several new initiatives were introduced last AY. As part of a growing pedagogical emphasis on purposeful learning at the university, the hall introduced a credit bearing academic module in the Second Semester. This is a historical event as it is the first time in the hall's history that it ran

its own module. From now onwards, this module, GEK1066 "Engaging the natural environment in ASEAN", will be offered to Eusoff residents in Semester Two of each AY. Designed to bring together classroom and experiential learning, this module serves to anchor our own Eusoff Expedition in academic content on environmental issues and human capacity building in Southeast Asia. In its first offer, the module was read by twenty two Eusoffians.

Another new development is a monthly e-letter which was launched in January 2014 to communicate hall news, events and practices to residents. Besides this, a new informal talk series entitled, the Eusoff Dinner Conversations. was introduced. In this gathering, residents discuss a wide range of topics over dinner with an inspirational speaker and share ideas in a relaxed environment. The aim is to create cosy conversations so that students can mingle, socialize and develop ease and confidence in meaningful social conversations. The first two Eusoff Dinner Conversations were kicked off last year. As from the coming year, all residents must sign up for at least one Dinner Conversation in each AY.

As I end my message for this yearbook, I wish all graduating seniors success in their job hunts and future careers. Years down the road, I know that future leaders of society will come from this year's graduating cohort. My hope is that you will remain connected to the hall by joining the Eusoff Alumni Association. To returning students, I look forward to welcome you back to hall life. Together with my hall colleagues and JCRC leaders, we will do our very best to create an inclusive, educationally stimulating and purposeful hall environment with abundant instructive, co-curricular and networking opportunities for you to explore, learn, and grow as responsible young adults.

Jarrod, besides your management of Social Services, your insightful comments in meetings helped the JCRC tremendously while your jokes made them a little more survivable.


Heng Yang, tough times do not last but tough people do. Thank you for all your contribution to Sports, and for all the encouragements along the way.

My first objective this year was to create a more objective method of assessment for committee heads to assess their members. This was done through the work plans, with committee heads stating explicitly the various 'KPI' for their members, and sticking to it (we made sure of that) even towards the deadlines before readmission.

Another improvement was the stronger recognition for external CCAs beyond Eusoff that contributed to student life in NUS.

We sought and encouraged Eusoffians to participate in external CCAs, and I tried my best to bargain for better points mirrored to what they would receive in Eusoff.

Residents can now hopefully find themselves in a more transparent and objective system that gives due credit.

2. Sponsorship: The redevelopment of the marketing/sponsorship committee was a step taken in order to consolidate Eusoff's corporate identity, as well as to improve our relations and work ethics with external organizations. This year saw the development of procedures for sponsorship, a centralized database of external companies, development of student marketers, and various successful cash sponsorships from companies by the committee. In future years, I do hope the committee can continue helping out with the various sponsorship needs of various Eusoff CCAs.

These were just some of the things spearheaded by the 26th JCRC, and limited by space, I shall keep the number to a lucky two - just because my girlfriend likes the number.

How others changed Eusoff

Change in Eusoff cannot be achieved through the vision and effort of one - it is the effort of every 485 residents, and ahem some squatters. And to that, whatever you see in Eusoff today, is really the product of hard work for the hall. 

My journey as Social Services Director has been a humbling and enriching. I will admit that as soon as work started, I realised there was much I had to learn whilst tackling the job. The experience opened my eyes towards the many issues and factors that had to be considered and kept at the back of my mind so as to effectively carry out the role as a JCRC member for the good of the Hall and for its residents.

I was spurred on to step up to be Social Services Director because of my work in hall at the community services front. My days as a volunteer at the Eusoff Voluntary Corps were my first formulative experiences of being a community services volunteer. The strong community service outreach of Eusoff Hall was actually what made me decide to apply to

stay here. Without a doubt I had made the right choice of Hall as I had many chances to give and learn during the experience. Stepping up as Director for EVC in my second year gave me a different perspective from that of a volunteer on the ground. Leading the Corps gave me insight into the management of a group of passionate volunteers and a perspective of the multitude of considerations that needed to be addressed to effectively manage it.

These experiences were foundational to my inspiration to run for Social Services Director as I was inspired to see what I could extract from my experiences on a committee level, to that across the Hall, and thus hopefully giving back to the Eusoffian community and structure that has shaped and moulded me.

My vision is to see a Hall banded together. No individual alone can achieve as much greatness as what can be achieved by a group of banded individuals fighting for a common cause. This same effect as observed in our IHG campaigns and Dance Productions was what I wanted to see within the Hall community for the social services front.

Because of this, I tried to find opportunities to involve more Eusoffians to give back to the

community. Some worked out, some didn't pull through, but in the end, I hope that ultimately, Eusoffians came out of the process of the academic year as individuals more concerned for their community.

This year saw Eusoff Hall bringing back the organisation of a blood drive in collaboration with 3 other Halls (Temasek, Sheares and King Edward VII) as a Combined Hall initiative to make it more convenient for Hall Residents to be blood donors. Over a period of three days (8-10th October 2013), the Halls pooled in resources and manpower to stage blood donation drives in turn at their respective venues in the Halls' premises for their residents and the NUS community. Eusoff Hall hosted together with Temasek Hall on the 8th of October on our premises at the Function Hall and saw many of our yellow blooded Eusoffians bleeding for a good cause. I was delighted and touched to see residents who never donated before come down and muster the courage to donate that day. On that day we saw 96 registrants whereby 64 successfully made a blood donation. Over the three days, a total of 177 blood units were donated (of 284 registrants) by the efforts from all four Halls. It's this power in numbers where each resident draws inspiration and strength from each other, which I love about our Hall.

During the Christmas break, our Eusoff Choir engaged with a new client for their annual Christmas Caroling by visiting the wards at the National University Hospital. Our choristers brought along some Christmas cheer to the wards over two days, singing Christmas carols to the delight of the patients, nurses and doctors on duty. It was a different experience for our choir group but a rewarding one nonetheless. As I stood there watching the choir perform, more than once, a nurse or doctor would express how beautiful they sung and were sincerely thankful for our efforts in spreading some holiday cheer. I remember vividly of how one of the elderly ladies, upon understanding that there were to be caroling in the wards, immediately got up and beamed ever so widely. You don't forget a smile like that easily.

It's from these experiences over the year as the Social Services Director that kept me going. To witness and to play a part in the great

things that Eusoffians do with their talents and hearts; it has been simply inspirational to work with such an amazing batch of residents.

I can't express enough the gratitude I have for my committees of my portfolio, and in particular the heads of the following committees; Eusoff Voluntary Corps, Eusoff Expeditions and Green Committee. Thank you for continuing the great work that you do, for pushing the frontier and for trying out new initiatives. For continuing to nurture the members under your care with the enthusiasm that you possess and for inspiring them, as well as myself, with the good work that you do in creating a community service platform for the Hall residents. Thank you for making sure that the efforts of every volunteer was valued and for inspiring each and every one of them to care; pushing every volunteer to move ahead to live, love and learn and to impart an appreciation of the volunteer's role in raising awareness and in educating others on issues important to the causes we represent.

As the former Master of Eusoff Hall, I have had the privilege of ten years of education in residence. This may sound odd for the average reader who is a student. Why would the educator and Master of a Hall who is supposed to be "doing the educating", so to speak, talk about being educated himself? The older reader amongst you will no doubt appreciate in some measure what I am trying to get at.

My experience in Eusoff is nothing short of transformative. I came into the hall in 2003 with more than a fire in the belly, ready to transform Eusoff Hall, thinking that the resident years in Trinity College Cambridge ('82-'85), Max Rayne House of University College London ('85-'86), Kitchener House of Edinburgh University as SubWarden ('86-'90) and Sheares Hall NUS as Resident Fellow ('92-'03) would have equipped me with the skills to handle anything that came along. It is not that I didn't do anything for Eusoff Hall, which could be the subject of another lengthy article, which is not what this message is going to be about. It is about how life always brings us the unexpected and how we must always be ready to allow our cherished ideas to be challenged, and to learn from whatever opportunity we can get. All of us, however we wish to deny it, are works in progress, at almost every stage of our lives.

Founding Master Professor Andrew Tay had suggested I start work earlier than scheduled, and I agreed. At the end of that fateful first week in 2003, the SARS epidemic struck Singapore; Eusoff Hall was not exempt from all the emergency measures that had to be put in place to protect everyone. I had to learn pretty fast how to be a Crisis Incident Commander, long before the university put in place the by-now familiar SOP (standard operating procedures) for safety and risk management. Fortunately, Andrew Tay left behind a very cohesive team of RFs and Office staff. Thankfully, we were to survive that dark episode of Singapore unscathed.

I was trained under the tutelage of the masterful Master-maker, Professor Lawrence Chia, Master of Dunearn Road Hostel (DRH) and of Sheares Hall, who had had more than a dozen resident fellows and mentorees under him eventually step up to become Hall Masters. His motto of "partnership in leadership" for all RFs left a firm impression in me, but little did I know how difficult it was for me to bring it to live in Eusoff Hall. I had a lot to learn about how to manage as Master, our student leadership, our student community, our office executive team, and our esteemed resident and non-resident fellows, and of course, our Alumni, all of whom were most generous in their forbearance of my idiosyncracies and impatient drive to push initiatives and projects at double-quick time without pondering the impact, value and appropriateness for the Eusoffian context. I was to have a lot to learn.

One obvious mistake was to tinker with the well-worn formula of the Hall catering system. Counterintuitive to me, I was to eventually learn, after loss of one really dedicated Hall RF, and one upset Hall manager, and a series of unsuccessful caterers, that the minimum sum guarantee is the benchmark caterers in the industry used to set the standard and quality of the food catered. By modifying this crucial system in the bid to enhance the food quality and optimise the accounts, I had created the opposite effect. What a hard lesson to learn!

With our student leadership, more lessons were in store, but I quickly found out one way into the hearts of our students was through their stomachs. So there came about the traditional JCRC incoming-outgoing dinner and other dinners which I hosted, particularly the incoming-outgoing Student President one-on-one private dinner. Student elected leaders are the choice of the student community. To get Hall projects through, it had to go through them. Anything less than a situation of mutual respect and trust, was not going to work, certainly not in Eusoff Hall, where our students possessed a much stronger independent streak. The dinner events initiated and continued that harmonious relationship between SCRC and JCRC leadership which we enjoy today.

"Never too old to learn."

One early lesson I learnt, was that in dealing with highly talented individuals and the well-oiled machine of the student leadership, my job became increasingly that of "getting out of the way of talented people". Which is not to say one should be doing nothing, but to proactively identify ways in which we can allow our very talented students the space to breathe, to grow, to blossom and to spread their wings, with plenty of leeway and wiggle room. One remarkable example was Grace Koh's initiative to set up Eusoff Expeditions, which is now into its 9th year. My job had to become that of facilitator and introducer which was a difficult lesson to learn because of my hands-on approach to everything.

The next lesson was to come from IHG Director and subsequently JCRC President, Wong Sheau Yann, who was to dramatically transform the Sporting landscape of Eusoff from always being a runner-up to Temasek Hall since 1998, to a sustainable championship leader. The success of a leader is only in the success of her successor. While we may win a championship once, the true test of leadership is whether we have left the ship in better shape than before, and in a way which can sustain success in future generations. We were to proceed to clinch the IHG overall championship every year for the next six consecutive years, each leader in IHG handing over the baton to the next, and returning back to support the successor. Every leader must be fully invested in ensuring that his successor succeeds, wherever possible more than himself. That way, succession planning begins from day one of any leader's mandate. Hence in handing over the reins to Master Goh Beng Lan, I have reassured her on many occasions, my commitment to be fully invested in her success as the third Master of Eusoff Hall in Kent Ridge Campus.



Kindness and courtesy did not come naturally to a busy man, always in a rush to complete a thousand tasks, such as myself. I had been a slave-driving leader before in many of my other projects, many award-winning ones, in which I was a slave-driver to myself just as much if not much more, but that was poor excuse for treating people less than respectfully. Till today, I frequently have to apologise to my former staff for my less than honourable conduct, whenever I meet them, and whenever I think about them and how I treated them. There is a way of setting high standards without unsettling others, and the art of good leadership is not to succeed on the bloodied shoulders of people who look up to our leadership, as much as our own shoulders have been bloodied too. There is always a way to do things in a much nicer way. I am still struggling to learn this lesson, but I have changed significantly, not enough, but nevertheless sufficiently for former colleagues to notice, less harsh, less abrasive, more measured, and calibrated. Perhaps mellowed with age, as they say.

These are the lessons that have changed me. More to come I sure...

And I should welcome them as life changing lessons. To all Eusoffians, perhaps, there may be a lesson or two for you as I recount my own lessons. Set high standards of excellence for yourself as you go through life with its ups and downs. Avoid mediocrity. Be a beacon of light and hope for others to follow, but bear it about you with uncommon humility. It will be to you better than anything else as you remember our motto, Excellence and Harmony.

Make sure your secretary is like Sylvia.














Rag Day




4. Your experience as the Rag Heads (handling the stress, motivating the team etc)

Performance:





2. What are your block's most distinguishable traits?


No senior-junior divide, spontaneity, united and A DISCO BALL IN THE LOUNGE!
