


THE CREST

The crest's main features are an orchid, an eagle and an open book.

The orchid, a vanda Miss Joachim and the national flower of Singapore, is a hardy but delicate flower symbolising stalwart Eusoffian traditions of loyalty, dignity, integrity and honour to hall and nation, balanced with harmony, beauty and grace. The retention of the orchid reminds Eusoffians of the origins of the hall's traditions in Eusoff College.


Eusoff Voluntary Corps

It was more about whether I would be able to handle the stress of seeing this kids, kids as young months old, going through chemotherapy, operations, injections and all things bad that a child should never have to go through. And there are the parents...I do not think I would ever understand the turmoil in them unless I myself become a parent to a child with cancer (God forbid).

From blood donations to mooncake celebrations for old folks to Sentosa outings for the mentally disabled to Christmas parties for children with cancer, EVC has put in a tremendous amount of effort in making the lives of others who are more unfortunate at least a little better. During the mooncake festival, I was standing at the bridge looking at the old folks watching the performances and I wonder 'How much of this can make up for the fact that they are not with their families...' IN AUGUST 1998, Eusoff Hall commemorated its tenth year at the Kent Ridge campus. Not only was it a significant moment in the history of the hall but the celebrations which ensued were also the most elaborate ever seen. From the gala event in August that year to the Hall bazaar six months later followed by the climatic Dinner and Dance in March 1999, every event bore the theme of the tenth anniversary.

Planning for the year long festivities began with the inauguration of the 10th Junior Common Room Committee in August 1997. After this, the Tenth Anniversary Committee, or **X** (roman numeral for ten) comm. was formed. To ensure success, detailed planning began as early as December 1997.

All in all, there were about ten VIP tables in the function hall. The other hall residents were seated in the dining hall and watched the cultural performances via a video linkup.

This had been meticulously arranged by the X comm. The capsule contained memorabilia of special significance to the hall. One item that stood out was the IHG victory jacket in recognition of the hall's recent triumph at the Inter-Hall Games in February 1998. Other items included block T-shirts, a yearbook and various photographs.

The Tenth anniversary dinner was not the end of the celebrations but only the beginning. In all, the celebrations lasted an entire academic year with the finale being the Dinner and Dance, "Opus X" in March 1999.



we're going to conquer KR hill as a whole hall now .. NOW???


yeah.. BANG BANG BANG


