Yet would have.








The Coke Addict






"If I had to be born a girl in Asia"

(Reproduced from a speech made by Mr. Lee Kuan Yew at the Eusoff 10th. Anniversary Dinner on 5th Oct. 1968.)

WOMEN have pushed themselves well into the campus of the University of Singapore—nearly 50% of the undergrads are of the fairer sex. Although this auguers well for the next generation, there will be problems like the conflict between home and work. The creche and kindergarten are inadequate substitutes for the home."

"Perhaps we shall have to learn like the advanced societies, that the investment a country puts into its women does not give the same kinds of returns one expects to get from its male citizens. For five to seven years after marriage there may be a hiatus in the economic returns as the woman devotes most of her time to raising the family."

Mr. Lee then went on to give two reasons why, if he had to be born a girl in Asia, he would choose to be born in Singapore.

'First, in nearly all the other countries in Asia there are patriarchal societies where the male ascendency is so complete that the female is almost an atrophied social version of the male. Next, they are mostly polygamous societies.'

'Singapore is a society where the weight of tradition is least stifling and the debris of history can be more easily sloughed off. When the traditional social fabric of old societies do not offer the woman an equal place, it is extremely difficult to change this quickly. This was true not only of non-industrialised Asian nations. It was also true of the Japanese. They are a highly industrialised nation. But the process of modernisation has not altered the social relationships between their males and females.''

Back to Singapore:

''Second, as a centre of communications exposed to almost all contemporary thinking via the newspaper, the cinema, the television screen, contacts with visiting men and women and new ideas, our society

is stimulated by what has been and is happening in all the main centres of human civilisation. So, we are better prepared to meet the challenge of the modern world."

'Thirdly, there are very few countries where women have equal educational opportunities and equal pay.''

'Singapore women pay separate income tax on their earned income. Recently, when government servants had their salaries and salary scales revised, the government decided that it would convert all women officers, like the man, to the new salary scales as if they were married, with children.

Now women in government service have an advance over the men—the men cannot have maternity leave!"

This however, leads to the question whether these benefits might not tend in the long run to leave most women graduates in government service as the private sector shies off the equal pay plus maternity benefits given to women.

The Prime Minister asked: "What will happen to the next generation? What quality of men or women will they be?"

'First, it depends on what genetic qualities we have in our present generation. I found that when visiting the schools, most of the children in the not-so-good schools have brothers and sisters by the dozens but in the better schools children of educated parents have only 1 or 2 or 3 in the family.''

''So, unless the better equipped stake out a bigger part of the future for their progeny, then the future will be that much poorer for all.''

Educational experts, psychologists and physiologists agreed that education began almost from the day the mother communicated with the child, not from the day the child goes to kindergarten or school. There are no substitutes for the nurturing and

nourishing a child received from his or her parents, principally the mother. And there is a very big difference between an educated and an uneducated mother. Let us for the purposes of argument, accept that educational and social performances, more or less are equal to intelligence and other qualities which make for better performance. If you look at the population I.Q. pyramid of Singapore, then as a community we want that pyramid to get steeper and higher.

"At the moment that pyramid is getting broader and lower. And this is happening in several parts of the world."

RAFFLES-EUSOFF WELFARE CORPS



The Corps came into being early this academic year with only a handful of interested residents from Raffles Hall and Eusoff College. Drawn together by mutual concern for the sick, the handicapped and the underprivileged this small body of students were determined to bring comfort and cheer to these people and also to help them in whatever way possible to overcome their obstacles, problems and other inconveniences. The membership grew in number as news of the Corps spread around until at present, we have 50 members. In the initial stages, the Corps started work in Woodbridge, Tan Tock Seng Hospital and the Spastic Association. Valuable advice and help has been given by the two advicers, Mrs. Hon and Miss Koh Tai Ann.

In Woodbridge, a mobile library was started. For two hours on every Tuesdays, Fridays and Saturdays, some of the students would wheel magazines and books to the men's and women's wards. In the process of loaning out magazines students made efforts to make friends with the patients. This service was also extended to patients in the Chronic Sick Hospital. Most of these patients here are usually alone or deserted by families. The hope of being discharged is very slim, thus most of their lives will be spent in loneliness and boredom in the hospital. Therefore it does them good to have magazines to read and visitors to talk to.

Twice a week in Tan Tock Seng some of the students would push trolleys of soaps, toothbrushes, toothpastes and other little things the patients might need to the wards. This saves the patients from a lot of inconvenience of walking long distances. This is one way where students get to know the patients.

In the Spastic Association, 16 students helped in the classrooms, the occupational therapy department and in the playing field. However, since there were already a lot of other voluntary workers we felt that our service there was redundant. Thus our work was terminated at the Spastics and rechannelled to the Toa Payoh Girls Home. Here we gave tuition to the older girls, and organised games, singing and other recreational activities. We would have liked to do more, but because of lack of facilities and funds our activities were very much reduced.


Short term activities of the Corps consists of selling tickets for various charitable organisations, helping organise Christmas Parties for underprivileged children and offering our services for any welfare functions.

At the moment activities have slowed down considerably because of the coming examination. Visits to Toa Payoh Girls Home have been terminated because of the school holidays.

The Corps has been formed and good work done. It has been a good year and now with the experience we have gained, we hope to carry out our activities with more effectiveness next year. We all believe we can do so much if we try our very best. May our Corps grow in spirit as in force.


